

Is This Thing On?

Bringing Voice Chat to the Virtual Bedroom by Crixxus


Skype and Discord, along with numerous other applications, allows for safe, anonymous and free verbal communication online with voice quality as good as your phone. It's a great and common way to connect with friends online, so it's not surprising that many cybersexuals are curious about adding it to their erotic repertoire.

From personal experience I can definitively say that voice chat can add an exciting new dimension to cybersex. Hearing your partner's sultry descriptions, playful bedroom talk and their excitement as you share a deeply passionate virtual experience takes cybersex to a whole new level, while at the same time preserving the security and fantasy of conventional cybersex. That said, there are also risks and drawbacks, which is why I advise caution when it comes to introducing voice chat to your online lovers, not to mention how it may affect your real life ones.

How does it work?

Normally cybersex is handled via typed messages, and when you're typing there's time. Time to rephrase something you're wanting to describe. Time to think about how to express a sensation. Time to think twice and take back something that might be misunderstood.

Time is a luxury most cybersexuals are accustomed too, and which doesn't exist when it comes to voice chat. The instant you accept a voice chat you're "doing it live". Everything is happening *now*, and if you want



to excite your partner you'll need more than skillful fingers stroking mouse and keys. You'll need a quick wit and a silver tongue.


Instead of typing you're sharing through verbal description, keeping your hands free for other things (an obvious benefit). You'll get to hear the warmth and growing excitement of your partner's voice, which in turn can feed your own arousal. You'll be able to tell that they're fully engaged. Their desire as they tease and purr. The sweet sound of their sensuality and, if you do your job well, the amazing experience of hearing your partner experience a deep, blissful orgasm.

Adding voice chat can make cybersex raw and passionate and unfiltered, the loss of time to

consider words making for an unscripted experience in which more of your partner's genuine sensuality can be expressed. In a very real sense you'll be sharing the erotic dream world that cybersex unlocks on a whole new level, riding that sweet boundary between fantasy and reality like never before. In short, the rewards of voice chat can indeed be incredible, but there's a few things to consider before you plug in your headset and hit the call button.

Stress & Insecurity

Not everyone is great at talking. Many cybersexuals exist because they're less than talented when it comes to verbal skills. People who can craft erotic prose that has you on the edge of your seat, possessing the most colorfully wicked minds imaginable, can also be the ones that freeze when put in front of a microphone, and for them adding voice chat to cybersex can be painfully embarrassing and stressful.

There's also those who are deeply selfconscious about their voices. Many people literally cringe when hearing how they sound in recordings, and for them trying to engage in erotic voice chat is near impossible as it makes them feel profoundly unattractive.

Another problem can be a sense of dissonance and disconnect between your avatar and yourself. People in their 50's do not sound like people in their 20's. Voices naturally change as we age, and may not match the universally youthful avatars you see on sites like 3dx.

Likewise male players who play as futanari might find their voices far too deep and masculine to convey they feminine aspects of such transsexual personas. Voice chat takes them out of the fantasy that is at the core of cybersex's appeal, and thus ruins the experience.

Naturally all of these hurdles can be potentially overcome, especially if patience is exercised and time given to adjust and get comfortable with the new style of play. After all, if you can type it you can say it, but suffice to say, there's plenty of perfectly understandable reasons an online lover might shy away from voice chat.

Blurring the Lines


Voice chat overlaps what occurs in real life, and that can turn voice chat into a fun and rich experience, or an outright unpleasant one.

Many people who come to play online have real life wives and husbands, and setting aside the whole debate about whether such people are engaged in a 'cyber affair' or not, the fact is most would strongly prefer not to mix reality with their fantasies. Even if their real life partner is totally okay with the idea that they play online, it can be a very different matter when they hear their wife actually talking dirty to another man, or their husband engaged in sweet pillow talk with the woman he just finished enjoying.

In addition, there are also issues of privacy. Even if they're not attached in real life, many people have roommates, or live with their families, and while the click of keys gives nothing away about what they're up to online, the sensual banter of voice chat is another matter. To really enjoy the experience you can't be self-conscious, and having someone in the next room that might overhear you isn't ideal for that.

Starting the Conversation

So how do you know if voice chat is going to work for you and your online lovers? The easiest way is to have an open, no-pressure conversation about it, discussing all the pros and cons, and assuming your partner is okay with taking that step it's best to take it slow. Start with a regular conversation. Get used to each other's voices. Wander around the virtual world together doing non-sexual things, and ease into the new dimension of interaction.



For some, particularly those involved in an online relationship, that alone can be a great experience, and there are some couples who happily chatter and flirt for hours, then turn off the voice chat when it's time to slip between the digital sheets because they prefer their cybersex in a text format (though the opposite arrangement is also common). Likewise it might take a few days, or weeks, or even months for a partner to get really comfortable with the idea of adding voice to cybersex, and need the time to transition from written prose to literally giving a voice to their sensual desires.

The key, as when introducing any kink to a lover, is to be honest and open and patient with your partner. To not pressure them into sharing their voice but rather to help them find it.

The Best of Both Worlds

The Pleasures and Pitfalls of Playing as a Futanari by Futalicious

Futanari is the Japanese word for hermaphroditism - and is commonly used online to describe generally female looking avatars that display the primary sexual characteristics of both men and women (breasts and a penis, though some futanari are played as also having a vagina). Futanari, of futa for short, make up a large minority of avatars on adult MMOs such as 3dx, with their own dedicated rooms, clubs and virtual subculture. Ignoring the politics and controversies of gender in the real world, in the virtual domain, futa are unquestionably a well-established third gender, and are typically played as having been 'born' as such.

As with males and females, stereotypes have formed around futa. Generally speaking they're seen as being very akin to males in terms of assertiveness and libido, but with otherwise typically female mannerisms. Most futa prefer to be referred to in female terms (such as 'she' and 'her'), and when they aren't with each other typically socialize with women. When it comes to sex, most futa



seem to be primarily interested in either females or other futa, though there is a significant number who are truly pansexual, happy to enjoy time with all genders.

But why as play one?

The Pleasures

There are several advantages of playing as a futa. First of all, whatever your biological gender in real life, being a futa online is a great way to explore your sexuality. A futa is the perfect hybrid of male and female, and is given social license to behave as either. Nobody is going to look sideways at a futa who aggressively hits on girls, nor one that cries when she's sad. Whatever your biological gender, playing as a futa can afford you tremendous freedom of expression.

Secondly, futa have a much more vibrant and active community online than either men or women. Certainly there are 'women only', and occasionally 'men only' rooms, though all pale in comparison to the futa ones in terms of popularity. As a whole futa tend to be gregarious and fun-loving, and the mere fact that you're a futa gives you immediate access to a welcoming social group. Simply put, futa have more fun.

Thirdly, futa are considered attractive to a very significant number of both men and women, who view their mix of sexual traits as being the best of all worlds. When it comes to sexual partners futa have access to unparalleled variety, being able to enjoy lovers of all genders if they so wish. Again, futa have more fun.

All the above being stated, there are also several reasons why playing as a futa can have

serious drawbacks, and before deciding to commit to playing one, these should be considered.

The Pitfalls

As mentioned above, there are well established stereotypes about futanari at least as prevalent online as those about men and women, and like it or not these will color how people view you till they get to know you on a deeper level. Futa are often viewed as being obsessed with sex to the point where they don't really have any other significant personality traits. Many believe that all futa are only interested in fucking, and that any friendship or other type of relationship with them will always be incredibly shallow, based entirely around the futa's insatiable lust. This can result in many people - even other futa ignoring the fact that the person behind the avatar has feelings and may indeed be interested in forging emotional connections. Just like men and women, futa are more than merely 'sex machines', but that myth is extremely well entrenched.

Another serious pitfall is a general stigma all futa suffer, though it's not really related to the kind transsexual people may encounter in real life. After all, people who frequent adult MMOs are not known for being sexually closed-minded.

In the case of the online community, there are a large number of players who view futanari players as being immature: bumbling teenagers or stunted adults who are trying to play 'comic book' characters rather than genuinely expressing themselves online. Futa are simply not taken as seriously as other avatars, and again this can harm the potential of futanari players to develop the kind of romantic and platonic relationships their male and female peers do. What's worse is that many in the futanari community, having had their attempts at friendship dismissed or rebuffed multiple times, have simply given up and embraced a flat, hedonistic existence. This just feeds the stereotype, making it even harder for others to shake it off.

The final pitfall of playing as futa has to do with sexual preferences. While a significant minority of men and women find futanari to be sexually attractive, the fact is that most do not. While many people might be willing to be friends, a deeper romantic relationship just isn't going to be in the cards. More than one futa has carried a torch for a man or woman, only to have their hopes dashed when the object of their desire inevitably finds a lover more to their tastes.

Interested in futanari? Check out the website of Lewdua, an erotic artist who portrays futa as not just erotic and exotic, but shy, loving and human.

This might not seem important when you're first starting out, but people being people, we all form emotional attachments online, and sometimes they're quite powerful. By choosing to play as a futanari, understand that you may be shutting yourself out of future romances, and that the rejection may wind up stinging much more than you anticipated.

The Evolution of the Futa

It's an uphill battle, but slowly futa are starting to develop a deeper and richer online subculture, with many becoming DJs, builders and socialites in the larger online community. As futanari are 'normalized' more people are dropping the stereotypes and even developing attractions that they didn't previously have, and it's quite possible that within a few years many of the downsides mentioned above will become less pronounced, or perhaps disappear all together.

In the meantime the option to play as futa offers both tremendous benefits and challenges, and while the role isn't right for everyone, its definitely one to consider especially if you're creative and adventurous.


Step One: Knowing What You Want


Looking for a warm, caring, romantic relationship full of cozy snuggles and sweet lovemaking?

What about juggling a stable of hardcore lovers, all on call to fuck your brains out?

How about a polyamorous circle of friends with benefits, all enjoying good times and good company between happy mini-orgies?

Maybe a thrilling BDSM relationship where you bow before your Domme, licking her boots and enjoying the sweet cruelty of her attentions?





Obviously these are all very different kinds of lifestyles and relationships, and none of them are likely to happen if you're presenting yourself as another boring, generic avatar.

And that leads us to step #2...

Step Two: Your Avatar is Your Billboard

Does your avatar reflect what it is you want? Your avatar is the very first thing people see online. Fail to catch the attention of those you're looking for and you're at a huge disadvantage when it comes to building your ideal online love life.

If you want to be a player, look like a player.

If you want to be a slut, look like a slut.

You need to look the part for whoever you're after, and that means putting some real thought and effort into your appearance. And that's something few people - especially guys bother doing.

You wouldn't pay for a billboard or television commercial and then leave it blank. Don't pay for an avatar and then make it anonymous.

Step Three: Craft Your Profile

You spot a hot avatar that seems to embody all that you desire. The right look. The right feel. So eagerly you click on their profile, wanting to know more.

And it's blank. Or confusing. Or a wall of text that makes War & Peace look like a leaflet.

Don't be that person.

Your profile shouldn't be your biography. It should be a quick, useful and engaging way for people to know what *you can do for them*. Nothing more and nothing less.

And yes, you read that right.

Out of the gate no stranger cares what it is *you* want. They care about what *they* want. And to find the kind of person who won't stay a stranger you need to make it very clear what you're offering. Here's a few examples:

- Fun, sexy party girl here, ready to rock the clubs before going back to your place to rock your world. Let's show 3dx how to to have a good time!
- Sex is great. So is the partying. But it's connection and romance that makes this game really fun. Let's talk and see if the chemistry is right.
- I'm a harsh but fair teacher, ready to train submissive girls who know what's good for them in the arts of erotic servitude. Message me, but only if you're ready to learn.
- Vanilla is yummy, but chocolate is sweeter! If you've got a BBC then I'm just the kind of girl you're looking for - you show me yours and I'll show you mine.
- Futa stands for Fun Uninhibited Tutor for Amateurs. Always wanted to ride a nice big futanari cock but never had the chance? Well, today might just be your lucky day...



Step Four: A picture is worth a 1,000 words.

There's a myth that only men are visually orientated, but if you flip through any woman's magazine you'll see that's not true. People in general are attracted to bold, powerful and colorful images, so whatever your profile picture is it should be appealing to those you're looking to attract.

Don't put up a picture of your cock if you're looking for a meaningful relationship, and don't have an image of you standing in a field of kittens and flowers if your main goal is to enjoy interracial gang bangs. Your profile picture should suit your avatar and profile text as much as possible.

Also, never put up a picture of yourself from real life, and here's why: If you're not hot then nobody wants to see you, and if you are hot nobody will believe the picture is really you. There's just no winning with real pictures.

Step Five: Speak up. Get noticed. Make Friends.

Walk into most crowded rooms on an adult MMO like 3dx and you'll find a handful of people doing all the chat on local. Guess who gets all the attention?

Most people are shy so they don't say much, if anything, and that's bad. You lose the opportunity to stand out from the crowd *and* you're not networking with the game's socialites.

The outgoing people who chatter the most typically have the biggest social circles. Become friends with them and you can get introduced to their social circle, and that means a lot more chances to meet exactly the kind of person or people you're looking for. "Out of the gate no stranger cares what it is you want. They care about what they want."

Even if you're not socially gifted, do your best to engage in local chat even if it's just by reacting to what the social butterflies have to say. And if you ever have a chance to join clubs or circles of friend then jump on them. The wider you throw the net, the more fish you'll catch.

Step Six: Stop saying, "Hi. How are you?"

This next step is mostly aimed at the guys, because normally its them who are doing the approaching (just like in real life).

The average girl on an adult MMO, assuming she's hanging out in a crowded, public room, will get messaged every few minutes by some hapless male with zero game.

And almost always those guys will send almost exactly the same message:

Hi. How are you?

We're fine. And seeing as we girls get that message so regularly we could set a watch by it, you *need* to do better to catch our attention. Look at our avatar. Look at our profile. Look at the pictures in our gallery. Look at the gifts we've been given, and then try something like this...

- Wow! Just love your gallery. Those have got to be the sexiest pictures I've ever seen on 3dx. Who's the artist?
- Hey there. Saw in your profile you got a gift from KarenXXX. She's a friend of mine too. You going to her DJ gig this evening?
- Don't mean to bother you, but just read the poem you posted on your profile. It's really good. Did you write it?
- See you're into bikers. You ride in real life, or are guys like me your fantasy?
- According to your profile you're a submissive. Why don't we test that? I'm going to send you an invite. Accept it.
- Hello. I'm new to the game and by the number of gifts you've got its obvious you're really popular. Don't mean to bug you, but I'd love some help getting started if you have the time.

Will it work every time? No. But it increases your odds of capturing our interest by a huge degree.

Step Seven: Invest in your relationships.

Nobody wants to spend time with a stalker. And nobody wants a hang out with a stranger either. Once you've found someone special, make a point of maintaining your presence in their virtual life without getting obsessive or creepy.

- When you see they're offline, leave them a little greeting or love note so that when they log on they'll see you were thinking of them.
- Every so often send them a little gift, just to let them know they're on your mind.

- If you get invited to a party, ask them if they want to come along.
- Check their profile regularly, and comment on interesting changes they make.
- If you learn about a cool new build or mod or club, let them know.
- Never get jealous or possessive. It only drives people away from you.
- Limit contact to once every couple of days, unless they initiate it. If you never leave them alone, how can they miss you?

Step Eight: Be someone you'd want to be with.

The final step is the most important, because its what will give you the ongoing confidence you'll need to have the online lovelife you've always dreamed of: Get out and do stuff.

Patronize a club and get to know the owners. Learn how to DJ and spin some tunes. Organize a party. Take the time to help a new player get into the game. So build something amazing to share with others.

Everything you do online will build your reputation as a cool and generous person, and that's exactly the most attractive kind of player. The more you give, the more you get. Follow the advice laid out here and you'll not only find what you're looking for online, not only keep it, but open up the love life you've been missing.

Imaginary Family

The Surprising Secret Behind the Appeal of Incestuous Roleplay by MayBee

What did Cleopatra, Emperor Claudius, Charles Darwin and Edgar Allen Poe all have in common? Given the subject of this article you might have guessed it and you'd be right they all had incestuous relationships - sex with close family members.

Throughout history there are countless examples of the breaking of this sexual taboo, and of course there are many in today's pop culture. I hope it's no spoiler for you when I mention Jaime and Cersei Lannister. Or just have a look at the top search list on sites like PornHub.

People have always had a yearning for the sexually forbidden, so it probably shouldn't come as surprise that so many men and women have this fantasy - though *how* most

imagine it and *why* they find it attractive is very much misunderstood by those who don't share the kink.

Do I like this kink? Of course I do. I wouldn't write about it if I didn't. So let me tell you a little bit about the kink and my experience with it.

I first developed an interest in incest fantasies as a teenager, when I had a vivid, erotic dream about a (not blood related) relative. I remember and enjoy the memory of that dream till this day, but let me make it clear that I never had any sexual feelings towards any other members of my family. For me it was always fantasizing what might go in imaginary families - and that brings me to one of the biggest misconceptions about the kink.



There is a definite stigma to incestuous roleplay, with many people believing that those who enjoy it are fledgling rapists or, at the very least, twisted sexual deviants. Happily, nothing could be further from the truth. Over the years I've had the pleasure of playing out incest fantasies with numerous people - both men and women - and never once have I ever met anyone with any interest in actually having sex with their real life family members. Just as 99.9% of people who play violent video games don't want to go out into the real world and shoot people, the overwhelming majority of people into incestuous roleplay have exactly zero interest in sex with their real life parents or siblings.

Proof of this is easy to demonstrate. Teenage me found that the internet was a great source of videos and erotica about this topic ("http" stands for "Hoping To Track Pornography", right?), and I discovered that the stories got me even more stimulated than the vids. The human brain really is the largest sex organ, and it surprised me just how much content of this sort there was.

Hundreds of videos. Thousands of stories. And it occurred to me that perhaps I wasn't so strange, nor did I have anything to be ashamed about. After all, that amount of content wouldn't exist unless there were huge numbers of people viewing it, and if even 1% of those people were really sexual deviants we'd have a massive crime wave on our hands - which we don't.

My first encounter with virtual sex was with a program called "Sex Villa 3D". It was single player and had fairly limited game options, but the great thing was the pose and script editor. You could practically make your own CGI porn videos, and I had so much fun recreating my wildest fantasies with this tool. There were times I felt like a kinky Stephen "Hundreds of videos. Thousands of stories. And it occurred to me that perhaps I wasn't so strange, nor did I have anything to be ashamed about."

Spielberg, and to see the images in my mind come to life on my computer screen was a great experience!

Then one day I stumbled across an article with ratings on numerous erotic games and MMOs. Among them was Sexvilla 3D, but highest ranked of all was 3DXChat. That article piqued my interest and I took a second look at their homepage. Finally I decided to make an account as I thought it could be a nice improvement to playing alone.

Never could I have imagined what a ride I was about to go on! We all know that it's a game. A shared fantasy. But after I spent some time in 3DX and make an effort to see 'behind' the computer graphics, I came to really know some of the people that control the other avatars and found that many shared my kinks. And this is where 3DX really shines for me.

I love this safe, anonymous environment where everybody can be and do what they want, and the chance to freely interact with others like myself. And in that interaction I came to really understand the key factor that makes the incestuous kink so attractive to both me and so many others.

In most roleplay scenarios there is little in the way of intimacy. The sex can be hot. The passion burning bright. But there isn't the sense of deep love and connection which so many crave. What makes incestuous fantasies so wonderful is the sense of pure and unconditional love that exists between siblings, parents and other family relations the kind of deep affection which I hope everyone reading this article is familiar with. By taking that kind of feeling as a base, and then sexualizing it in a consensual, loving fantasy, one can make ordinary sex so much more exciting and satisfying - it's the romantic, the intimate and the deliciously taboo all rolled into one. The huge majority of people into incestuous roleplay aren't into the kink because they're callous or abusive, but rather for the opposite reason - because

they revel in the sense of connection and shared passion that it brings.

I could have been shy about my desires. Could have allowed myself to be "kink shamed" into hiding them, but refusing to bow to the stigma was the best decision I ever made. I'm the most lucky of women in that I managed to find a partner on 3DX that fully and openly shares my passion for the fantasy. We often play as sisters, or sometimes other female family members, and are happy to have our kinky friends join us to reenact and explore our wildest dreams together!

The graphics of the game are nice and the poses good, but it's the deeply intimate, loving and erotic scenes that I've shared with my partner and friends that are what makes cybersex so beautiful and amazing for me. Sometimes it happens that we bring each other to tremendous orgasms without more than the most basic of poses, the heady feel



of the connection making otherwise ordinary sex truly mind-blowing.

The beautifully crafted graphics of 3DX helps spark the imagination, but it's human connection and the wonder of shared imagination that make the experience for a true cybersexual. Online you can create and share your own reality, and who knows what the future brings? The era of virtual reality headsets had just begun, and the porn industry has always been a driving force of technology.

In a few years we could get lost in these worlds and even have physical stimulation while playing, and when that happens I can promise you one thing - I'll be exploring that brave new world with my whole taboo family! In real life, sex with close relatives is nothing I desire, but when it comes to cybersex then yes - for me and countless others - incest is best!


Five Styles of Online Marriages, and Why Each Might be the Right One For You by CupcakeCupid

Real life marriages today have an unfortunately high probability of failure, and of those that don't end up in outright divorce, many finish cold and loveless, sad relationships based primarily around paying bills and going through the motions necessary to maintain a household. It's tragic, especially for a hopeless romantic like myself, but its true, and it shouldn't come as a surprise that online marriages often end badly as well, with many lasting just a few months before they fizzle.

Fortunately, when it comes to the virtual world, we have a lot more freedom than real life typically affords us to craft relationships to our liking. This means that we have more potential for success, especially if we carefully weigh the options open to us, and there are plenty of forms a marriage can take.

Exclusive Marriages

Marriage could be argued to be primarily a matter of sexual dedication, and this is certainly the case when it comes to traditional, exclusive marriages. The nice thing about this type of marriage is that it's highly familiar since it mirrors the social norms of the real world: two partners agree that they will only have sex with each other, with any breach of this agreement being seen as a serious violation of trust and respect. There's pretty much no room for misunderstandings, and in a way this type of marriage could be said to be the most highly




romantic since both people are dedicating themselves to each other.

The virtual world is nothing if not full of temptations, however, and the downsides to this kind of arrangement are significant. Staying exclusive with someone, even someone you really love and care about, can be highly challenging when constantly faced with abundant sexual opportunities. This becomes even harder on sites like 3dx sex chat, where the entire online culture is hypersexualized in comparison to real life, and pretty much every friendship comes with benefits.

Exclusive relationships may start out romantic, but the huge majority rapidly get mired in drama as one, or both, partners almost inevitably break their vows and have what are often extremely hurtful affairs. Pretty much the only times they function is when they're a reflection of a real life marriage; two married people who come online to explore the virtual world together so as to spice things up a bit.

Open Marriages

Open marriages are far more common online than exclusive ones, and for good reason. Rather than constantly fighting temptation, both partners come to the conclusion that affairs would be an inevitability, and so gift each other permission to sleep with others. Normally the arrangement is that the couple will be each other's primary lovers, first in line when it comes to time, affection and sex. This does greatly reduce stress in most relationships, but sadly proves to have almost



as high a failure rate as exclusive relationships for a number of reasons.

The first is jealousy. Its one thing to say that you're okay with your partner having sex with other people, but what happens when every time you come online they're off having fun with the same person? What happens when you arrive and they've already been sexually satisfied and just want to cuddle when you're horny as hell? What about when that other lover, or lovers, leave gifts on your spouses' profile, along with cryptic messages about what an amazing time they had together?

The second reason is that feelings happen. When you have sex with people other than your primary partner you will develop your favorites, and that leads to a sense of closeness, which is followed by emotional connection. Before you know it, your spouse is no longer the person that's first and foremost on your mind, the novelty of your new partner supplanting the dreamy-eyed affection the two of you once shared. And when that happens the marriage is effectively over.

Open marriages seem like an enlightened, libertarian system of marriage that solves the problems of temptation, but far more often than not they simply replace one problem with another. While exclusive marriages could be argued to be too rigid for most people, open marriages are too flexible, with the push of jealousy and the pull of novelty quickly combining to tear them apart. As a result they tend to fare only marginally better.

Polyamorous Marriages

Imagine you're in an exclusive marriage, but both you and your spouse find yourself drawn to a close friend, or perhaps even another couple. Suppose you're in an open marriage, and you and your partner discover that you "Its one thing to say that you're okay with your partner having sex with other people, but what happens when every time you come online they're off having fun with the same person?"

both spend a lot of time with a common playmate. In both these cases a polyamorous relationship can develop: a marriage between three or more people.

The great thing about such marriages is that they offer a lot more variety, and not just in terms of having an extra spouse or two you can enjoy time with. The combinations of romantic and erotic experiences can open up whole worlds of exploration when it comes to group sex and homoerotic exploration, and help combat the temptations presented by those outside the marriage. They also provide spouses with extra support in cases where one can't come online for a time, or where one partner requires extra attention due to an emotional or health issue. In cases of polygamy you can effect have more than just a marriage, but a family of close and nurturing individuals who tend to all each other's needs.

As always, however, there are downsides. To begin with, the conditions required for a polyamorous marriage to occur are pretty specific. It can be hard enough trying to find one person who wants to dedicate their online life to you and your happiness. Try finding not just another person like that, but one who also happens to fit well with the tastes and needs of your present spouse as well. And just because a new spouse says that they love both of you equally, that doesn't make it necessarily true. Often the new spouse is in love with just one of the people in the marriage, and acquiesce to the polyamorous marriage purely as a means to be with them. They may try to hide this fact, but sooner or later it becomes apparent that the new spouse has no real affection for half of the original couple or, worse yet, resents them as a rival and a competitor for affection. In such cases the addition of a new spouse to the marriage merely exacerbates problems rather than solving them, and the marriage eventually shatters, with one member being divorced by the other two. If you thought a regular breakup was painful, imagine what the feeling of being rejected by two or more people might be like.

Polyamorous marriages are rare both because they're difficult to form in the first place, and because any significant imbalance in loyalty or affections causes the marriage to splinter. Once again, this type of marriage fails a large majority of the time, and really doesn't offer any better odds than the exclusive or open alternatives.

Contract Marriages

No, I'm not talking about Asian mail order brides or some arranged marriage out of the Middle Ages here.

While every marriage is in effect a contract between two (or more) people, they are very unusual contracts in that they are assumed to last forever. Nobody signs up to a cell phone plan 'for life', or joins the military 'for eternity'. In virtually every other type of contract either a limit exists on how long it lasts, or a quick and easy means of termination is available. The contract marriage is based around the particularly unromantic notion that all marriages, given enough time, will fail. So rather than attempt the herculean task of building a romantic edifice that will last forever more, the contract marriage simply has an expiration date.

Typically, the arrangement starts out with a 'trial period' of a month. Both partners agree to an exclusive or open arrangement for 30 days, with the understanding that, once that's over, either partner are free to walk away without hard feelings if it's just not working for them. Assuming the couple still wants to be together after that, they renew the contract but this time for a longer period, typically two months. Assuming they make it through that the third contract is for three months, and generally stays at that length going forward, the spouses making a quarterly decision as to whether they want to stay together or not, and having the ability to adjust terms as they go. A contract marriage might start off as exclusive and then become open, or vice versa, or even switch back and forth with each contract.



Surprisingly, this arrangement works really, really well, at least so far as it goes. Knowing that their spouse may choose not to renew the contract gives an incentive to be a better husband or wife, and as time goes by the marriage is viewed more as a continued and meaningful investment rather than a onetime decision that might come to be regretted. The temptation of infidelity is also greatly reduced because spouses realize that they always have the option to not renew their marriage soon enough, and can always go be with a new partner then without having broken any vows. And speaking of vows, the constant renewal of them help keep romance alive, with continuous ceremonies reminding both spouses why they're together in the first place.

The downside to such marriages is that they are rather pragmatic, which doesn't feed into the romantic desires and fantasies of people (like myself). They also are built specifically to end, which isn't great if you're looking for the security of a "happily ever after". On the other hand, contract marriages work really well, especially online. The percentage which fail, not counting a decision to not renew, is actually quite small, and overall they tend to last much, much longer than the other types of marriage discussed above.

Paid Marriages

A fifth type of online marriage is the paid marriage, a highly unusual yet surprisingly stable and enduring arrangement. Simply put, in a paid marriage one spouse pays the other to stay, obey, and remain loyal to them, effectively filling the role of husband or wife in a rather mercenary capacity. Typically a man with some extra funds makes an offer to a girl he finds attractive; in return for being her 'sugar daddy', she stays by his side, in every way behaving as his sexy, happy and dedicated wife, though 'sugar mommies' are not unheard of.

Many would argue that this is not a 'real marriage', but the truth is that all marriages are contracts, and contracts exist to define and regulate an exchange. While this exchange is normally one of mutual love, support and sexual availability, there's nothing saying that money can't change hands. Historically, and in many parts of the modern world, dowries are a normal part of getting married.

When it comes to online marriages, it's typical that one partner pays for the other's subscription, allowing them freedom to enjoy the game as they see fit when alone online. The second the paying partner returns, however, their spouse is expected to drop everything and rush to their side, immediately taking on the spousal role they've agreed to play.

For the partner that pays, there is a sense of power, stability and freedom, which may be well worth a few dollars a month in subscription fees. And seeing as part of such relationships is typically keeping the exchange of money a secrct, there is no stigma. To outsiders it appears that the paying spouse has a dedicated and loving long term partner. For the partner that gets paid, there's a sense that their company is truly (and literally) valued by their spouse, and that they are never taken for granted. They enjoy their autonomy a large portion of the time, but also have the sense of being part of an ongoing relationship. Ironically, real feelings tend to develop over time, and many paid marriages evolve into stable open or even exclusive arrangements.

The downside of such marriages is that, at least starting out, they can feel extremely artificial, much more akin to prostitution than a fairy tale romance. And, when starting out, they do require an expenditure of resources that many people simply aren't willing to make. There's no denying that paid marriages are not going to be to everyone's tastes, but then again there's always that old adage to consider: you get what you pay for.

Which one is right for you?

All of the styles of marriage listed above can be very successful, and none are immune from failure. It all depends on the individuals involved and what they want and need. The success rate of each is observable, however, and if you're looking to simply play the odds, some types are, statistically speaking, better bets than others.

Number 5: Exclusive Marriages

Overall, this type of online relationship has the lowest rate of success. Almost all disintegrate within months, if not weeks, or transform into open marriages when the spouses realize that the arrangement is simply not sustainable. Again, there are couples that have been in vibrant, happy exclusive marriages for years, but those are, unfortunately, very much the outliers.

Number 4 / 3: Open & Polyamorous Marriages

These types of marriages are pretty much identical when it comes to their odds of long term success, and that is to say they do marginally better than exclusive relationships. Again, there are those couples (and threesomes and foursomes and moresomes) who make them work, but if you're a betting person the odds are not in your favor.

Number 2: Paid Marriages

For better or for worse, money talks, and of those open or exclusive marriages that seem to work out, a significant percentage are in reality paid marriages. Maybe it says something about us as human beings, but the



majority of paid marriages work out really well, and when it comes to reliability soundly beat many other more traditional arrangements.

Number 1: Contract Marriages

When it comes to long term stability there's only one type of marriage that beats paid marriages, and that's contract marriages. In practice the continuous need to renew vows, and the ability to renegotiate them, leads to much greater happiness as each spouse can never take each other for granted. In the end real love trumps money, but only so long as that love is conditional on continuous and mutual respect and evolution.

One Final Word...

Just as in real life, online marriage can bring immense happiness and fulfillment, or bitter hurt and disappointment. It all depends on the people involved, and how well the structure of the marriage suits them. No matter what type of marriage you choose, know that the long term success of all of them is based on kindness, honor and patience. All marriages are only as good as the vows their based on, so whatever path you take, make sure you keep your promises.

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The End of Mods?

An Interview With AlexRyder, the Father of 3DX Chat Modding by JamieSweet

Since at least 2016, two 3DX Chat modders have been responsible for the most popular mods in the game: Nella Rochi and AlexRyder. Between them they've allowed for a huge expansion in player creativity, making room building and sharing possible before the launch of the world builder, providing a huge range of new clothing options for players and adding all kinds of interesting and useful new features such as an extended chat window, the ability to use "ghosts" to create new sex poses and a means of saving outfits. Without them the weird and wild sex toys of the BDSM community wouldn't exist. Nor would many exotic sex positions. And the general appearance of the 3DX Chat world's avatars would be far more bland and uniform than they are.

Yet today rumors are circulating that this golden age of creativity is about to come to an abrupt end due to upcoming changes being implemented by the game's developers. I had the privilege of having a brief interview with AlexRyder about the past, present and future of mods in 3DX Chat, and gained some insights into the situation players face today. What I discovered was both enlightening and troubling.

Most players are content to just play games like 3DX Chat. What was it that got you interested in modifying the game?

Not sure how to answer that. I just like to stick my nose inside programs or something. I think I just wanted to check if something

could be done to fix certain stuff (like raising the message limit in chat). Not sure. It was a long time ago.

When your first mod appeared, how did the players and management, react?

I have no idea how to answer such questions. I never carried out any social investigations.

Most people liked it, I think. Some didn't like certain features (like being able to read messages from / by ignored characters). Some people just call any modifications "hacks" and have a religious-grade hatred towards them. No idea how their brains work. 3dx developers mostly don't care unless users start to bug them, I think, and probably get annoyed with topics like "my game stopped working after the update" every time someone tries to update a modded game.

Do you know other people who work on mods for the game? Are you part of a "community", or do you all work alone?

I know Rochi, and I've heard that there are and were other people modding the game. I do my stuff alone and usually have no idea what's happening beyond that.

What would you say your main objectives were? Did you achieve what you set out to do? Is there stuff that you look back on and wish you'd approached differently?

I'm not sure exactly what you're referring to. Achieve certain goals with modding? Well, it's kind of a never ending process. There are always some ideas to add, and no free time to do it.

Done differently how? There were certainly a lot of things I did wrong while coding, and I had to completely rework those, but that's also a normal thing with development, I think.

There's a lot of concern that 3DX Chat is going to be changing soon in a way that is going to make all the existing mods nonfunctional. Is this rumor true, and if so, does this mean an end to mods for the game?

If the developers switch to IL2CPP compilation instead of the usual IL version, it will no longer be possible to decompile/edit game code dlls easily. IL2CPP compiles code into a single native binary, working with it will be pretty much like working with any other app compiled to a native binary. Some simple hacks will certainly still be possible, but doing any complicated stuff will most likely not be worth the effort.

There is still stuff like dll injection and other hacking techniques, but in any case the number of things that can be done to the game's code will be majorly crippled, especially considering that working with managed code is almost like working with actual sources. You can just decompile all of the code and work with it like you would normally, keeping in mind certain Unityrelated aspects with serialization and resources being compiled already, but otherwise its pretty straightforward.

So yeah, with the new IL2CPP compilation it will still be possible to patch stuff like the ignore system or the room list filter, but adding actual useful content, not so much. IL2CPP is faster though.

I've heard that you know Gizmo, the game's primary administrator. Do you feel he understands how important mods are to 3DX Chat's players?

I don't really know him. I've just talked to Gizmo a few times, but I have no idea how he thinks.

You have a lot of admirers among the game's player base. A lot of people who deeply appreciate the work you, and others, do to add new features to the game. Do you have a message you'd like to share with the players of 3DX?

Nah, I'm not a speech making type of person, and most people I've met have no idea who I am anyway. I was kind of expecting it would me more about mods, like, specific technical stuff, not about me.

What other questions should I have asked?

I don't know. How about tools and the workflow? Most of which won't matter soon anyway though...

Yeah, that's kind of why I didn't ask.

Imagine a cross between a sexual roller coaster and a marathon and you'll get the idea. For those into ahegao, too much sexual stimulation is never enough.

Bimboism

Massive fake boobs. A huge curvaceous butt. Full lips. Copious makeup. Wasp-like waist. Spray-on tan. And a plastic, deliberately artificial appearance. These are the hallmarks of those into the kink of bimboism.

For women into this kink the fun is in making yourself into as much of a sex object as you possibly can, reveling in the sensation of being utterly sexually objectified - and in a way it takes a certain amount of courage to display such a politically incorrect sexuality so brazenly.

While the term "bimbo" normally refers to a women of great beauty but low intelligence, few women into bimboism are stupid. For them the kink is an outrageous celebration of their own femininity, exaggerated for the sheer joy of turning heads everywhere they go.

Dubcon

Dubcon is short for "Dubious Consent", that kind of sex where there's definitely some coercion going on, but at the same time nobody is actually saying "no".

You could be forgiven for confusing dubcon with rape play (also known as "consensual non-consent), in which completely consensual partners roleplay a very non-consensual scene such as a kidnapping or blackmail, but this kink is its own thing.

For some people there's a desire to just be taken. For a stranger to possess them sexually in a way only a familiar and committed lover normally would. A mix of power play, anonymous sex and intimacy in which, whether there's a choice to have sex or not, its irrelevant because one partner is simply submitting to the desires of the other and getting off on their own helplessness.

Emosex

Are you only into sex when its a gloomy, loveless, darkly ironic act? If so, Emosex might be just the kink for you. For some sex is hottest when neither partner seem remotely into it, both acting as if it was a grim but necessary chore, required but not enjoyed. Guys into emosex thrust into their partners with stoic or bored expressions, while the girls appear to simply lay back and study the ceiling.

Not exactly everyone's idea of a good time, but when two people into this kink get together there's an amazing amount of sex that goes on for a couple so apparently uninterested.

Gerbaling

No, this isn't some twisted animal cruelty fetish having to do with Richard Gere. To gerbal someone is simply the kink of having them consume your ejaculate from your hand.

"Imagine a cross between a sexual roller coaster and a marathon and you'll get the idea." The kink is expressed by a man removing his penis from his partner after intercourse, ejaculating into his cupped hand, and then feeding it to them much as one might feed a treat to a dog. Though a fetish for sperm is hardly uncommon, this kink blends it with either playful submission or sexual humiliation, depending on how it is done.

Kinkdogging

Some people seem very prim and proper, dressing, speaking and acting conservatively, and never even hinting that they have any special sexual interests at all. But for people with this kink the purity and innocence is just an act, something their partners will be shocked (or delighted) to discover as soon as they coax the kinkdog into the bedroom.

The dials get turned up from one to eleven, with literally every sex act imaginable not only on the table, but actively and eagerly desired. Stuckage

For the zelophiliac there's no permission. No sharing. No free love ideals or polyamory. The entire thrill is in being cheated on, knowing that you're being sexually betrayed. They're the mirror images, and perhaps ideal companions, of those who get off on having affairs.

Beyond the Public Rooms of 3DX Chat, There's Another World of Pleasure *by Nym*


A few months ago a brand new 3DX Chat player, JamieSweet, noticed that the public sex rooms were just... awful. The vast majority of players there had no clue how to engage in exciting, descriptive cybersex, with the majority being completely silent, apparently interested only in throwing her avatar around like a sex doll, utterly indifferent to any kind of engagement beyond endless pose shuffling.

So Jamie decided to do something about that.

Within a couple of weeks she sought out the best erotic roleplayers she could find, inviting them to a private orgy at a room she'd carefully designed just for the occasion. Having a group of such highly engaging, descriptive and imaginative people at the event made a world of difference, and the orgy was a huge success - but Jamie didn't stop there.

She organized another orgy, then another, and quickly word of the event spread from player to player. The group steadily increased in size right up till today - with over fifteen successful events and over 200 players on the guest list. And 3dx SwingSet (the name Jamie gave to the group) is still going strong.

I had the pleasure of interviewing Jamie who, in interests of full disclosure, is a friend of mine and editor of this magazine, and asked her what inspired such a new player to

dedicate to much time to organizing these ongoing events, and what her plans for the future are.

What brought you to 3DX Chat?

I've been into cybersex for years, but I never really moved beyond text-based chat rooms. Mostly I spent my time on F-List, and it was there that I learned how to be descriptive. Developed my own style. And also got introduced to a lot of the kinks that really excite me, group sex being one of my favorites, obviously.

I was aware of adult MMOs for a long time, but never made the jump to them because I didn't have a credit card - and wasn't too eager to explain the charges if I borrowed my mom's. Eventually I got my own, however, and it was then that I figured it was time to take my "hobby" to the next level.

Were the sex rooms your first stop?

In a word, yes. Soon as I got an understanding of the controls and figured out all the basics of chat and navigation, those were where I headed first. Probably shouldn't admit that but it's true. And I can't tell you how disappointed I was when I got there.

What was your first experience like?

Really, really bad. I'd encountered really mediocre sex partners on F-List before. Heck, I'm sure for a long time I *was* a mediocre sex partner. But the first guy who messaged me didn't even say a word beyond his invitation, and he was literally prompting me to change poses every 30 seconds. If I hadn't had as much experience as I'd had on F-list I would have quit the game right there and then. It was just so unappealing, but I knew that there had to be better playmates online.

How did your first orgy happen?

I was very lucky to run into PlatoConsidered, an amazing gentleman who has been organizing small orgies on 3dx for ages. It was him who introduced me to other descriptive players. Showed me just how wonderful cybersex could be in a 3d environment, and who encouraged me to organize my first event.

I know a lot of people say they don't care what anyone else thinks of them, but I'm not one of those people. I care very much about pleasing others, and so went a bit overboard to try to make the first event a perfect as I could. Whole reason I learned to build was so that I could create just the right space for it, and I obsessed over the date and time, who to invite and how to make sure they enjoyed themselves. Honestly I was more than a little obsessed with it, though I guess that worked out for the best.

Your first event was a success?

It was amazing, but that wasn't because of me. Amazing people were kind enough to take pity on this hapless newbie so painfully eager to please. And once those high skilled players were in the room it was incredible. Night and day compared to my experience in the public sex rooms, and I knew right then that I wanted to make this a regular thing. Partly for myself, of course, but partly because I knew there was the potential to offer something really special to others.

All events are moderated so that there are no trolls, stalkers or silent players. Everyone with an desire for descriptive cybersex is welcome, and no, perfection is not expected.

Obviously you just kept on going.

I did, but I only succeeded the way I did because so many people helped me. Plato, like I mentioned, introduced me to tons of great players and helped me organize the events. Arron volunteered to build rooms for me, and they were just amazing. Far better than anything I could have ever made.

And along the way there were just so many people who introduced me to their friends, made a point of attending and supporting my events. I wish I could name them all but I think it would fill up a whole page. There was just so much kindness and encouragement that I get a little teary just thinking about it. The people on 3DX Chat are just amazing, and every bit of success I've had with SwingSet is because of them. I didn't even come up with that name "SwingSet". It was suggested to me by a wonderful player named Lubber.

How many orgies have you run so far?

So far SwingSet has run sixteen events, and the turnout keeps getting better and better. We do two every weekend now. A "North American" orgy on Friday nights, and a "Euro" orgy on Sundays at a time slot better suited for our British and European members. Its been a huge amount of fun, and the sex has been fantastic! Honestly I couldn't be happier with how things have worked out, and I'm so thankful to everyone who made it happen.

What are your future plans for SwingSet?

Well, this is the part were we shamelessly plug our own website, Nym. I have a dream to not just hold orgies, but all kinds of fun and sexy events, and to promote them on the Modz website. There's been a huge amount of interest in expanding and diversifying what I started, and over the past couple of months an amazing group of players have come together to make it happen.

DiscoStuart, DianaPrincess, Aprilx, Malcy, Cerca, PlatoConsidered, Carus, SadieC, DireTeddyBear, RickSim, WildHoney, Downriverden, Tsela, Crixxus, ChristineSimmons, Nathan and Elena Drake and I know I'm missing about another dozen or so other amazing people - that have all jumped on board to help organize and staff and build amazing rooms for new events. I get kind of emotional when I think about how many friends I've made here on 3DX Chat. Their support and enthusiasm drive me. I feel more than a little blessed.
