

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

Music Speaks

DJ Ninja Girl's guide to breaking into 3DX's amazing music scene. by JamieSweet

Natsumi, better known as DJ NinjaGirl, has been bringing music to 3DX Chat for five years – gifting players with hundreds of hours of amazing parties and concerts, and helping contribute to the game world's libertine culture and frenetically upbeat soundtrack.

Along the way, she's learned a lot about what it takes to make it as a popular DJ, and sourced a plethora of resources that any aspiring disk jockey would find invaluable. As such, Cybersex magazine was honored to have her sit down and share some of her knowledge and wisdom with our readers in the following interview.

Cybersex: There's a lot of people on 3DX Sex Chat interested in becoming DJs, but not too many really know how to get started.

Natsumi: Well, first you have to get up and running, and there are several DJ software and service subscriptions to choose from. It really depends on your preferences and budget.

Many DJs, including myself, use Shoutcast as the stream provider and Winamp as the player for said service. One other provider is Virtual DJ which also has a broadcast feature, but their services are on the expensive side.



Cybersex: Once you have the ability to stream online, where do you get your music from?

Natsumi: Ah, that is an interesting topic. The easiest and cheapest way would be to use an mp3 converter for YouTube. While this method is kind of frowned upon by some in the community, it's still commonly used.

Now, you also have the option of using Spotify and iTunes as long as you have the software to upload the songs you want to your player. But the most legit way for creating music is done by hand on various DJ/mixer software. Some, like Mixxx, are even open source and free to download.

You also have the option of using a DJ Deck, if you have the software and equipment for it.

Cybersex: Can you tell our readers about that last option?

Natsumi: There are various DJ Decks and most of them can cost hundreds of dollars. They're for a hands on DJ experience, meaning the DJ will be playing fully live from their broadcast.

Cybersex: Sounds like professional-level equipment.

Natsumi: Yes. Those that invest in such equipment know what they're doing and are on a higher level than most DJs found on 3DX: Achilles, JessicaX and DJ Nixxx, just to name a few.

Cybersex: I've noticed that some of the higher level DJs also have some pretty cool intros. They sound really professional.

Natsumi: They're called DJ drops. There are websites which provide customizable drops, and some are created by the DJs themselves.



Basically DJ drops are an announcement to the crowd as to who's performing, and they can help convey a sense of hype and style which is why a lot of people use them. Personally I don't have a DJ drop besides the "Hey listen!" of Navi before every first set that I play.

Cybersex: Obviously over time you've developed your own, unique style. Do you have any advice for new DJs on how to develop theirs?

Natsumi: Hmm... that's a very hard question. Music itself is universal and there are hundreds of different genres and subgenres of music. Your style is going to end up at as a combination of the music you enjoy and what works with your audience. You have to tap into your own creativity and interests and have a period of trial and error to see what works, as opposed to trying to copy someone else's style.

When I first started out I hardly had any knowledge of what EDM was. I had to listen to countless hours to figure out what songs were for me as well as what I thought my audience might find appealing. You have to be thoughtful about this because music in itself has a way of molding people to act in certain ways, both online and in the real world.

Cybersex: That sounds very interesting. Do you mind expanding on that a bit for our readers?

Natsumi: Everyone has had an experience where music affected their emotions. Their energy level. Their ability to relax or get excited. And in a place like 3DX where everything is shaped by imagination, music inspires.

For example, depending on the BPM (beats per minute), the mood for sex and romance can vary. Without music you'd be watching a silent film of avatars going at it, which would be way less appealing to most people. Music simply shapes and fuels the experience.

Cybersex: Could you tell me a bit about the 3DX music community? Should a new DJ make an effort to get involved with it and, if so, what's the best way to do that?

Natsumi: Back when 3DX was still new there weren't many options when it came to music.

The 3DX radio was convenient, but had some issues. There were also very few players that actually DJ'd. It wasn't until late 2015 when streaming and DJing really got started and many DJs, including me, popped up. Everyone supported each other, and a community formed.

That community was very open, and it still is today. I don't see any reason why a new DJ wouldn't want to get involved with it, and that's as simple as talking to more established DJs and making friends. It might take you a little while to get recognized by the community, of course, but you have to start somewhere.

Another reason you'd want to get involved is so you can get some mentoring. There are many veteran players that are more than happy to provide help to those starting out and may even help them book gigs at clubs and venues depending on scheduling.

Cybersex: So, aside from yourself, who are some of the biggest names on 3DX right now?

Natsumi: Currently we have WildHoney, DJ Xanar, Icebox, Stellania, DJ Starrfyre, Achilles, Gremio, DJ AAKs, and that's just naming a few. DJ Ashbash, who was my inspiration in becoming a DJ, is another important name.

Cybersex: Would you say that most of the DJs on 3DX know each other fairly well?

Natsumi: Yes. Most DJs that have been playing for three years or more know each other very well and often go to each other's parties and events. Because of that finding and meeting people in the community really isn't that hard – especially when you can get involved with groups like the BDSMetal Gang.

Cybersex: So is that the best way to get gigs?

Natsumi: Yes. Knowing the right people can help a lot. When I first started out I might as well have been invisible to people. It was thanks to friends like DJ Nixxx, Chloe and Ashbash that I was able to make a name for myself in the 3DX community.

In my case claiming to be the the 'Ninja Kitty of 3DX' hundreds of times also helped inspire some interest in me.

Cybersex: So is that the name you used to go by? Ninja Kitty?

Natsumi: Ninja Kitty is a nickname I went with for my avi as a whole. I didn't really have a stage name so when I created a second character I just put the two together and DJ NinjaGirl was born.

I wanted my name and nicknames to stand out. To be something people would remember so they'd know who I was and what I did when I came up in conversation. And that's another tip for new DJs. Try to come up with a name that will stick in people's heads.

Cybersex: Are there any other ways you'd recommend that new DJs try promoting themselves?

Natsumi: Well, one way is to use the 3DX forums and post an event that you've either created or been invited to. Another really simple way is to use World Chat to announce yourself. There are also discord servers dedicated to music and DJs that play in the 3DX community, so you can seek those out as well.

Cybersex: What would you say is the very best thing about being a DJ on 3DX?

Natsumi: The best thing about it for me is being able to share the music that I love with

everyone. If I let them hear what I've created, then hopefully they'll hear me for what I am.

I also love some of the huge events that take place that allow me to experience the styles of others. To get to know them, too, through their music.

Cybersex: Would you like to tell our readers a little bit about those?

Sometimes, but not often, well-known DJs such as myself will create special events catered towards a theme or just music in general. Music events are always a big hit on 3DX because the sex side is always very dominant. They're the biggest events ever held on 3DX.

The E-Series, Scare-Fest and Angel of Desire events, along with several others, have made a huge impact on the game.

What do you like least about being a DJ in 3DX? Is there anything that you find particularly frustrating or unpleasant that you'd like to warn new DJs about?

Natsumi: The biggest things for me would have to be the process of coming up with a set, and of course, technical issues.

Most sets played on 3DX are about an hour each. Having to pick and choose which song to put in or keep out can be tricky. And after all that work I've had several times where my stream froze up or crashed in the middle of DJing – and all the time I put in to crafting my set has been suddenly ruined.

Cybersex: Any special tricks or tips when it comes to avoiding those kind of disruptions?

Natsumi: Make sure you have a strong internet connection. I can't tell you how many times I had to cancel DJing because it was too choppy or would cut out too much.

Cybersex: Thank you, Natsumi, for sharing so much information with our readers today. Is there anything else you'd like to say?

Natsumi: When words fail, music speaks!


Bi Guys Make Better Lovers

In my years online I've had sex with both men and women, and had long lasting relationships with both. If I find someone sexy I'm not going to hide it, and I'm happy to work out what happens in the bedroom if and when we get there.

By having that policy, I've enjoyed a wide range of lovers, and learned a lot about not just myself, but others.

As I mentioned above, many people believe that being bisexual will somehow put women off, as if your masculinity is somehow defined by the gender of the people you date. In reality, a recent Australian study by the School of Health and Social Development found that women in relationships with bisexual men overwhelmingly say their partners are better lovers than straight men.

The "bi advantage" doesn't end at sex, though. Relationships are important, too. So you might be asking yourself if there are women out there who don't mind dating bisexual men. The short answer is yes. Lots and lots of them, in fact. But let me provide you with the full picture.

That they can talk to me about things they might find embarrassing with others, and know that I'm going to be non-judgemental.


Likewise my straight male friends certainly aren't worry about me hitting on them. Just because I've got the capacity to be attracted to both men and women doesn't mean I'm attracted to every guy and girl on 3DX. My friends are my friends, I like them for their jokes and conversations, creativity and company. 




Location: San Francisco, USA

Location: Austria



An award-winning adult MMO with good graphics, strong community and extensive options when it comes to sex poses. The game world is quite limited, unfortunately, though some see this as a plus in that it compels players to focus on each other rather than the scenery.

Location: Mountain View, USA



Definitely a "love it or hate it" adult MMO. Fans praise imvu for the great community, opportunities for creativity and the almost limitless variety of options. Detractors complain of a game plagued with endless glitches and security issues, and terrible customer support.

Also known as the "Meet n Fuck" Club, MNF Club is a 2D adult MMO. The game involves playing mini-games to earn cash and meeting other players to have sex with, both depicted with 3D flash animated graphics. Fun, but extremely cartoony.

Dealing with the Drama Llama

If you're online, chances are you know a drama llama. The player who demands perpetual attention, is always in the midst of a world-ending crisis and takes offense over the most trivial of matters.

They're the ones who always overreact, insisting that a smallest glitch requires a complete reinstall, or how the newest game update just ruined everything forever. When faced with the smallest setback — her boyfriend is five minutes late logging on, or the DJ didn't play his song request right away — they moan and exclaim, "Oh no! This can't be happening! Why me?"

Simply put, drama llamas simply love to make scenes; to them all the world's a stage, and they're always the star of the show.

We can all get at least a little theatrical from time to time, but there's a difference between those who make an occasional fuss over a friend's white lie or a particularly buggy play session, and those who have what psychologists term affect dysregulation.

Those with this condition are highly emotionally sensitive, and thus react both more quickly, and more extremely, to problems and challenges than normal. In addition they have a far harder time calming down, and will nurse grudges over even the most inconsequential of slights. Something that others may view as a little sad or upsetting will have a drama llama either sobbing or raging. Every little thing will make them carry on for days, and that's because

affect dysregulation is all about having a compulsion to socially display.

When you think about it, every person online is like a billboard, advertising who we are and what we desire. And we're not just talking about profiles.

Some people display with their avatar. Things like vibrant hair, a defiant stance or slutty clothes a signal for others. Some display with



language, such as constantly using long words to show how smart they are. Some display with their creations, such as homes or clubs that reflect who they are and how they want to be seen. And some with music, communicating their personalities though the tunes they spin as DJs.

Drama llamas, on the other hand, display through melodrama, using one manufactured crisis after another to get what they want, be it sympathy, love or attention. And as such displays work, at least most of the time, they just keep on creating them.

I'm reminded here of a girlfriend on 3DX who confided to me — and literally everyone else on Love Island — that she was sure her husband was having an affair. Why? Because he'd logged off fifteen minutes earlier than usual the night before.

So what do you do when you have a drama llama in your life? Follow three simple steps, and you'll find yourself having a much easier time of it.

Rule One: Don't Ask, Don't Tell

Never ask a drama llama how they're feeling, or how their day has been, and don't tell them about yours, either. They're bound to either have some ridiculous crisis brewing, or be ready to seize upon something in your life to turn into a major production.

Keep your conversations as general as possible when it comes to personal issues, and quickly change the topic the second any form of complaining or unsolicited advice begins.

Rule Two: Set Limits

Set limits and then stick with them. When your llama friend insists on discussing the

drama of the day despite your evasions, just reply with something like this:

"Sorry this is happening to you. I know you're stressed, and I'll tell you what I think if you want, but I have to go in 10 minutes.

Your drama llama will quickly learn that you won't stick around for more than a few minutes if they start complaining, so they'll either stop trying to foist artificial problems on you or simply seek out someone else to display their latest issues to.

Having a relationship with a drama llama can be a bit like watching a soap opera: trying to actually address the latest crisis is pointless as there will always be another, so you should simply sit back every now and then and just enjoy the show if you can.

Your Ilama friend will love having you as their audience, and you can enjoy their performance as they rant about the latest insult, disaster or tragedy.



Virtual Porn

It all started one boring day, hanging out alone at Sin Club. Even four years ago Sin was one of the most popular spots to chill, and that was why that fateful day there was a talent scout there looking for girls to photograph – none other than Ramrod, who was to become one of 3DX's most well known players.

Because none of my friends were around, he and I got talking, and the idea of being part of a photo shoot sounded fun. On a whim, I agreed to be one of his models, though little did I know that I was about to start down a path that would lead me to become one of 3DX's most prolific and well known porn stars, and to eventually work with just about every significant erotic artist there was.

Being in 3DX porn is something girls normally stumble into like I did, though it certainly takes a level of courage to put yourself out there. As a woman, I don't want everyone thinking I'm nothing but some cock hungry slut, as many men just assume porn stars are somehow without thoughts, feelings or preferences. Early on I learned that you have to be willing to deal with the fame (and infamy) that comes with the job, as it definitely has some downsides.

But despite the social challenges, being the star of virtual porn has been addictive. I can honestly say that I love being associated with the shoots and films I do. It piques my imagination as an artist and creator to work





with other erotically inventive people, and for me its so much fun building sets and brainstorming new scenes with which to awe our audience. Imagination and effort are the keys to long term success in the 3DX porn industry, and I've found that it helps to work with serious people you can get to know and trust, and who take the time to craft the best scenes they possibly can.

When you do good work, the rewards are wonderful. Being a porn star fuels the fantasy experience of the online world, my notoriety enhancing the game's already sensual atmosphere to whole new heights. Something I would never actually do in real life has become a reality on 3DX, and in my opinion that is exactly why most of us play — to enjoy a realm of absolute sexual freedom and uninhibitedly explore your desires from the safety of home.

So is becoming a virtual porn star something you'll find as rewarding as I have? Do you have what it takes to make content that's both popular and memorable, and to put in the time and effort needed for a great shoot? To help you find out I had the pleasure of sitting down with the legendary Ramrod, the man who got me started, And AceX, an up-and-coming creator with more than 50 shoots to his name, in back-to-back interviews I think you'll find enlightening if you've ever fantasized of posing for the camera, or being the one behind it.

3DX has grown to become the online world's premier experience in virtual smut, and as it has its gorgeous graphics has made fertile ground for its erotic photography community.

Can't anyone take screenshots of the hot adventures they have on 3DX Chat? Yes, of course they can. But it takes a special talent and a creative eye to get that camera angle just right, and to capture the very hottest moments in a night of passion.

Ramrod

One photographer who's consistently achieved this is Ramrod. I've had had the privilege of working with Ram (as he is known to many) several times, and he was kind enough to give me his insights on what it takes to be a successful 3DX pornographer.

Cybersex: How long have you been doing photo shoots here in 3dxchat?

Ramrod: I've been doing it since September 2015, so four years now.

Cybersex: What made you start doing shoots in the first place?

Ramrod: If I recall correctly, it started out with girl #1 asking me to take pics during the act — or maybe it was my idea — and then it blossomed from there. Shoots were very short during the start of it all, maybe 10-15 pics. Now my shoots are way more substantial.

Cybersex: So Ram, how many shoots have you done so far?

Ramrod: 540 published ones, many more unpublished. I think I have about 20 in the works of being published. Some never get completed due to disconnects and disappearances.

Cybersex: What do you look for in those you work with?

Ramrod: Real interest is the principal thing. In the beginning, before I made a name for myself, I used to have to recruit girls for scenes, which had varying results. Now women seek me out, which make things a lot easier.

Cybersex: What is your favorite type of scene to shoot? Do you have a preference?

Ramrod: It really depends on the mood, and also how much time I have. I'd have to say that my orgies and gangbangs are my most well renowned shoots. Threesomes in general are probably my favorite. Now the world editor makes it easy to make different things, because when I started it was all about making a room out of tables and such. A big shout out should go to Rochi and her mods. They saved me bigtime.

Cybersex: What one piece of advice can you give to those up-and-coming in 3DX porn?

Ramrod: The biggest tip I can share that won't

spill my 'secret sauce' is that facial expression is key. Most of the newbies don't bother with that and you can see it in their work. Take your time, get that right, and you're on your way. Ignore it, and your shoots are always going to look dull.

AceX

Cybersex: Ace, what was your secret to breaking into virtual porn when there were already so many people competing with established artists like Ramrod?

AceX: Mostly luck, I'd say. I'd definitely have to thank all the ladies I've worked with for the success I've had. They were a huge part of it.

Cybersex: So what would be your tips to new artists on producing a quality porn shoot here in 3DX Chat?

AceX: On the technical side of things, positioning can be a real pain in the ass if you don't have the proper triggers on certain objects. You have to capture the right pose at the right moment, and that takes patience and practice and planning. But the real challenge is finding the right talent to work with.

Your girls have to want to be photographed, and find the work fun and exciting. I think there's a sort of fantasy to be played out by participating in the online smut community of 3DX. After all, most of us love to play out the wild fantasies that we'll probably never get to do in real life, and that's the fun of virtual porn. If you're working with people like that, it'll show.

Don't go into it looking for fame. Go in to create something that other people can







enjoy. Do that and people will start paying attention.

One last piece of advice...

I've worked with so many wonderful people with great talents in photography, and a huge shout out goes to them all!

If you want to get into the virtual porn scene, the best thing to do is check out all their wonderful works at the links provided below. See which pictures and films you find the sexiest, and then think about what makes them so amazingly hot.

That's how you learn the secrets of composing your own work, and how you can apply what you learned from other people's work to your own creativity.





The Submissive Spectrum

The twelve archetypes of BDSM submissives. by DarkAmber

BDSM relationships, for the uninitiated, are typically imagined as a Fifty Shades of Greystyle arrangement between an experienced, highly authoritarian Dominant and his naïve female submissive.

The truth is of course far more complex than this stereotype, and there are a multitude of different power dynamics and relationship roles in BDSM culture, including ones which are sexual and non-sexual, playful and serious, casual and dedicated.

What makes a person a submissive?

When it comes to understanding BDSM, the first thing to realize is that submission doesn't look the same for every person, or every relationship. Service submissives spend their time anticipating their Dominant's needs and working to make their lives easier and more comfortable. Sexual submissives make themselves available for their Dominant's sexual pleasure in accordance with prenegotiated limits and mutual kinks. Pain submissives are simply masochistic, willingly subjecting themselves to their Dominant's sadistic desires. For some the Dominant / submissive dynamic is limited to the bedroom. For others it's a 24/7/365 lifestyle.

The only thing they all have in common is that they either are, or desire to be, in a deferent relationship with a dominant person in the context of bondage / sadomasochism.

The docile dozen

While few submissives can be neatly

categorized, there are twelve submissive archetypes which can be useful in classifying (and thus understanding) the needs and



desires of submissives. These include brats, cucks, degradees, exhibitionists, jades, littles, pain sluts, pets, rope bunnies, service submissives, sissies and slaves.

Brats

A brat is a submissive who purposefully misbehaves or acts out in ways against their Dominant's wishes. This can be for attention, to test limits, or provoke punishment (also known as "funishments" since the brat typically enjoys the humiliation aspect of being punished, or for purely masochistic reasons). As their name implies, such behavior is normally playful in nature, and not intended to be disrespectful of the Dominant.

Cucks


Cucks (short for cuckolds) are submissive males who generally have ordinary, "vanilla" relationships with wives or girlfriends, with one notable exception – they enjoy the


humiliation of their partner not only having sex with others, but doing so as blatantly as possible and letting the cuck know how much more enjoyable the experience is than it would be with the cuck.

Typically cucks become sexually excited by hearing how inferior they are in comparison to their partner's other lovers, and enjoy being compared unfavorably in terms of attractiveness, technique and endowment. There are also female cucks, known as cuckqueans, who are identical to their male counterparts save for the flipping of genders.

Degradees

Some submissives find pleasure in extreme acts of humiliation, and revel in the emotional catharsis of being treated in ways most people would find uncomfortable to even witness, let alone be subject to. Examples of such treatment include being called names such as whore, slut, faggot, or bitch, having their





appearance and body ridiculed, having their Dominant spit, ejaculate or urinate on them, and being forced to perform embarrassing tasks in public.

Exhibitionists

Known as *showgirls*, these submissives love being 'arm candy' for their Dominants, and are excited to use their beauty and sexuality to enhance the social status of those they serve. Not surprisingly, exhibitionists are normally found wearing as little as possible, and making a show of sitting in their Dominant's lap – or at their feet – positively beaming with affection.

Whatever an exhibitionist does, be it dancing for their Dominant's pleasure, strutting

along by their side or even having sex with their friends, they love to be seen by others.

Jades

Prostitution fantasies are fairly common among women, though jades take it to a whole other level. They love their Dominants doubling as pimps, and delight in being sent out to sexually earn rewards in the names of their partners. There are, in effect, eager whores who enjoy the combination of independence, challenge (and possibly humiliation) of engaging in such voluntary sex work.

Littles

A little is an adult who adopts a markedly

childlike role in a BDSM relationship, looking to their Dom for protection and care. This type of power dynamic is often highly affectionate, and normally involves a lot of dressing up and childish activities, as well as being spoiled and punished by their Mommy/Daddy.

It should be pointed out that littles and their Dominants are rarely interested in the idea of roleplaying underaged sexual encounters. They simply find the warmth and simplicity of a parent / child style relationship attractive, and so try to emulate it in a decidedly adult manner. In short neither littles, nor their partners, are any more likely to have pedophilic tendencies than any other couple.

Pain Sluts

The 'M' in BDSM stands for masochist, a person who derives sexual gratification from their own pain or humiliation. In the case of Pain Sluts, their focus is entirely on the former. Though most submissives enjoy a good spanking and the like, the category of pain slut is generally applied only to someone who can't get enough sexual agony, and loves to push boundaries in that direction – often to a degree that would cause many to wince.

Sex with a pain slut is more akin to a torture session than vanilla lovemaking, so the negotiation of limits is particularly important with them.

Pets

This type of submissive often loves puppies, kittens, and bunnies so much so that they like to act like such a cuddly pet for their Dominant (at least to a degree). Submissive acts are typically playful in nature, such as crawling on all fours or making silly animal sounds.

Pet play can vary in what the submissive 'gets out of it'. Some enjoy the exhibitionism and



dehumanization of such a role, while others may enjoy the free, primal sensation of just relaxing while their 'owner' strokes or pets them. In either case, it should be recognized that pet play is no more related to bestiality than dressing up as a playboy bunny is.

Rope Bunnies

Bondage is the 'B' in BDSM, and just as pain sluts focus on just a single aspect of this kind of relationship, so do rope bunnies. For them the sensation of being helpless is simply delicious, and no matter whether it's ropes, cuffs, stocks or chains that hold them, they love being rendered as prone and exposed as possible.

Service Submissives

Of all the types of submissives, the role of service submissive is decidedly the least sexual. They simply love to serve, and can typically found organizing, decorating, DJing and building for the Dominant's pleasure, getting satisfaction out of being their partner's loyal retainer.

In the case of certain polyamorous relationships in which a Dominant has a harem of submissives, a service submissive might be placed in the role of monitoring the group, seeing to it that order and discipline is maintained, and that the Dominant is alerted to any needs or desires which are not being met. Service submissives in this 'administrative' role are sometimes referred to as *Alpha submissives*.

Sissies

Sissification, or feminization, involves "forcing" a consenting male into a traditionally female role, often including costumes such as school girl or maid uniforms. Tasks set by the Dominant may be either sexual or not, but all play to the

submissive's excitement at fulfilling a role normally held by women.

This pleasure may be based in the humiliation of being made into a parody of a woman, or may be quite the opposite – an exhilaration of being able to experience being beautiful and feminine, and appreciated in a fashion most men will never will be.

Slaves

Of the twelve submissive archetypes the last are slaves.

A slave is a type of submissive who willingly gives over their will entirely to their Dominant, enjoying the paradoxical freedom of not having to make any decisions, set any limits or worry about any boundaries. Whatever their 'owner' tells them to do they do without question, and this utter compliance often puts them in a position of mutual disdain with other submissives.

Many submissives look at slaves as being mindless and weak, having no sense of self-respect. Even degradees and pain sluts tend to hold that opinion, in that at least they maintain a certain level of autonomy in that they took the time to negotiate and communicate their personal preferences with

their dominants.

Slaves, for their part, typically return this contempt, dismissing other submissives as not being 'hardcore' and lacking real loyalty and obedience to their Dominants. As such submissives and slaves often don't mix very well.

Submission Is What You Make It

In the end, there are no hard and fast rules about what it means to be a submissive, nor any neat pigeonholes into which everyone can be stuck. While archetypes can be useful when it comes to helping people define their preferences, they shouldn't be stuck to people except though self-identification.

The things that matter most in any BDSM relationship are communication, trust, and negotiation. No matter how you choose to surrender control during sex (or in other parts of your online life), your submissive experience will be whatever you make of it.

The best way to discover your likes and dislikes, and what you need versus what you want, is to communicate with your partner, learn as much as you can, and explore your sexuality. Only you can decide what type of submissive you are.

What is an affair?

Is it when you flirt with a co-worker, even though you're both dating other people? Is it a one-time, half-drunken kiss at a party when your spouse is in the other room? Is it that one night stand when your partner was away on a business trip? How about when it's a hot, sensual, deeply loving and ongoing relationship you share with a person who's not your significant other?

I think close to 100% of people would agree that the last example most definitely constitutes an affair, but what if you and your lover have never actually touched? Or spoken? Or even met?

Some might say that such a relationship still constitutes an affair because it's an emotional betrayal, but that assumes that all love has been transferred away from one's real life partner and invested elsewhere. It assumes that human beings aren't capable of deeply loving and romantically investing in more than one person at a time – and that's something we know is not the case.



Humans are social animals. Everything about the way our brains are wired has to do with making connections with others. Put a panda or tiger or lizard alone in a cage for a year with adequate space, food and water and they'll be fine. A human will, quite literally, go mad. And obviously normal people are capable of sharing platonic love with many others at one time – parents, siblings, friends and even pets.

So why is romantic and sexual love seen so differently?

How Cybersex Changed the Game

Part of this stems from the fact that sex tends to result in children, and generally speaking men don't have a huge amount of interest in supporting someone else's kids. Sure there are adoptions and step-children and the like, but for most of human history the whole point of sex was to mate and produce offspring that were your own.

Over time most societies developed a one man, one woman system of romantic relationships, with vast amount of literature, laws, social norms and religious teachings reinforcing that any other arrangement was not just taboo – but deeply immoral and deviant. And though that system had obvious flaws, it maintained social cohesion for many centuries.

Until the advent of cybersex, that is.

In the case of cybersex there is no risk of pregnancy. No risk of disease. In fact your partner isn't even there in a physical sense. There are countless people who have enjoyed long, happy, cybersexual relationships and never met their partner. In fact, they might not even know where in the world their partner lives.

And while the person on the other side of the screen is real, there is nothing intrinsically stopping a person from having a happy relationship with their real life, flesh and blood partner as well.

And whether or not society condones it, it's happening.

More and more people are having what are being dubbed as 'cyber affairs', to the point where a large portion of the populations of 3DX, Second Life, Red Light Center and other adult MMOs are engaged in them.

These relationships have zero in terms of physical risks, and are very inexpensive to maintain. The cost of a subscription fee is pretty much insignificant to most people's budgets – and thus a far cry from the hotel costs of sneaking out to be with a lover, the price of a sex worker or maintaining a mistress.



So the question that begs to be asked is this: If having an online relationship can be fun, fulfilling, safe and inexpensive, and not take away anything from a real life partnership, then why does it have to be considered a betrayal?

Enter Cyber Polyamory

Polyamory literally means many loves, and revolves around the simple concept of one person having more than a single meaningful sexual relationship at a time. In some cases polyamory can take on the form of a group – two men and one woman, for example – who don't mind actively sharing. But typically this isn't how polyamory works in practice.

Even in societies which allow for polygamy, the norm is for one person (the man) to have a largely separate relationship with each of his wives. The women in such relationships may share a home and domestic duties, but it's a rare case that a man takes two of his wives to bed at once.

Likewise, cyber polyamory is rarely a group relationship. Usually a person has their primary flesh and blood partner in the real world, with whom they have and raise children, share a home, and love and protect, and then secondary partners in cyberspace with whom they enjoy time as a "friend with benefits". Rather than being seen as a hurtful betrayal, open cyber polyamory offers people the excitement and variety of other partners, all while maintaining clear boundaries that keep the primary relationship safe and intact.

So how does one create that kind of 'have your cake and eat it too' relationship? What does it take to have wonderful sexual relationships in cyberspace, without endangering your real life partnership? The key is both openness and, paradoxically, a certain level of non-disclosure.

The Value of the Truth

If you're lying to your partner about any kind of cybersexual relationship you're having, even if it's by omission, then you're betraying them. You're cheating. You're having an affair. You can argue the technicalities and play with definitions. You might even be able to justify it. But at the end of the day that's what you're doing.

And, until relatively recently, that's what was happening with me.

I love my husband deeply. He's my true love. My soulmate. The person I want to spend my life with. Yet night after night I was effectively sneaking off to enjoy the company of online lovers.

I felt guilty and frustrated, and without a doubt it affected my real life relationship. The more secrets I hid the less I wanted to connect with him, the discomfort of having to conceal such a big part of myself making me question our closeness. After all, how could he really love me when he didn't know who I was? And even if he did, how could I be worthy of it?

I could have quit the online world. Stopped visiting cyberspace and just focused entirely on the real world. But I knew that denying myself such an important outlet in terms of both gratification and self-exploration wouldn't have brought us closer together. At worst, it would make me resentful of him, even though he'd done absolutely nothing wrong.

So I took a risk.

I sat down with him and told him what I'd been doing. What I'd experienced. What I'd learned. About the things I wanted to share with him. About the things I didn't. I confessed everything to him. And honestly, I wouldn't

have blamed him if he'd cut me off right then and there – not for the cybersex, but for keeping so much hidden from him for so long.

But that's not what happened.

My husband isn't stupid. He'd picked up on what was going on despite my efforts to hide it. And not knowing what I was up to made him fear the worst. He thought I didn't love him anymore. That he was no longer attractive to me. That rather than being the light of my life he'd become irrelevant.

And lying next to me in bed each night, he'd

wondered if tomorrow would be the day I packed my suitcases and left for another lover.

The confession was a relief. And it led to more conversation. To me understanding him better than I've ever done before, and for him understanding me.

That night we made love like never before. And while I won't get into specifics, it turns out we shared an amazing kink – one which we'd both been too embarrassed to talk about. The liberty of being open with him made both my real life and my virtual one so

much better, for now rather than having a cyber affair I'm engaged in cyber polyamory with the full consent of my amazing husband.

For us it's been a fairytale ending, but even fairytales have their provisos.

The Value of Respect

In each sexual relationship we enjoy there needs to be a certain level of respect and privacy, and that cuts all ways. I do not speak to my online lovers about what my husband and I get up to in the bedroom. I don't share our pillow talk. Our intimacies. His secrets and dreams and worries. And likewise I do not speak with my husband about theirs.

Each of us shares our unique and personal bonds and experiences with each other, and those can be absolutely magical and exciting. I'd love for my husband to come join me online someday. For him to experience cyber polyamory for himself. But I'd never expect nor want him to share the details of those relationships with me.

Cyber polyamory is about trust and sharing as much as it is about pleasure and

adventure. It's a tremendous gift a real life couple can give each other, and because of its innate boundaries it can be enjoyed — when done right — without jealousy.

What the Future Holds

As time goes by, and the technology that facilitates cyber polyamory becomes ever more pervasive, my story will become less and less unique. Already on 3DX, the adult MMO on which I spend my time, there are plenty of people in similar relationships to myself. Their numbers are growing, and as they do real world society is changing too.

As I mentioned earlier in this article, technology has fundamentally and irrevocably altered the way couples come together, and how their relationships form and solidify. And quite frankly, we live in an age of chaos where neither men nor women quite seem to know what's expected of them.

Many desire the warm and loving security of conservative, traditional arrangements. But with Pandora's Box opened, few can honestly they say they don't also yearn for a lifestyle of hedonistic sexual liberation. For 99% of human history these have been mutually exclusive wants, but today they are not.

I imagine a future where it's completely normal for every couple to have a beautiful classical marriage in the real world, and the excitement of a fantastic cybersex life. I hope for a time where everyone can enjoy that amazing blend of old and new that my husband and I share, and where our technology allows us the best of all worlds.

All I can say is that, for my husband and I, the future is now.

The Future of Cybersex

Three technologies that will drive the rise of cybersexuality, and the possible ramifications for humanity.


Of our five primary senses – sight, hearing, touch, taste and smell – only the first two are catered to online, be it on our computer monitors or virtual reality headsets. Devices which emulate the remaining three senses, apart from a handful of remotely controlled sex toys, are yet to become reality. In order for cybersex to gain widespread appeal in the mainstream market, at least the tactile must be realistically emulated, and for that a full body 'sensation suit' is needed.

What most people don't realize, not even cybersexuals, is that just such a suit has already been invented. The Tesla suit, a new technology that simulates the sensation of body contact, is already a reality.

The Tesla Suit

Developed by Scottish coporation Tesla Studios (in no way affiliated with Tesla Motors), the suit uses electro-muscle stimulation technology to accurately transmit the illusion of touch, emulating the way in which the human brain communicates with our various body parts. Pair it with a VR headset and you're not just seeing the world of your game, but feeling everything from its weather to the caress of other players.

"You could load any environment, from a beach, to any romantic place. Wherever your imagine would take you," claims Dimitree Marozau, the company's co-founder. "You could walk together. You could feel and touch each other. You could feel the effect of wind. It's a fully immersive experience."



It doesn't take a huge amount of imagination to see how not just the titillating sensations of cybersex could be made accessible to players, but the more subtle and romantic aspects of it too. With everything from kisses to caresses to playful spanks made tactile, there will be

popular appeal to both men and women alike.

In time, as technology advances, the experience of having sex with a partner who lives on the other side of the world may become almost identical to the personal experience of sex, and indeed could be considered preferable to the real thing.

Not only is cybersex inherently safer than pretty much any other form of sex (with zero possibility of sexually transmitted disease, unwanted pregnancy or sexual assault, it could also come to involve its own unique, intense, and perhaps even customizable, sensations. A type of highly personalized sexual experience that never existed previously.

Couple that with the aesthetic perfection of avatars, the beauty and richness of virtual worlds, and the incredibly low expense and high convenience of cybersex compared to dating or employing a sex worker, and a large portion of the population might just come to prefer virtual sex to the real experience – if only because cybersex would no longer be seen as a replacement, but an innately superior source of sexual intimacy and pleasure.

But the frontiers of cybersex certainly don't end with just the senses. Soon even romantic interaction itself may be replaced by something different and new – artificial intelligences programmed to be the perfect lovers.

Replika

Beside the most well-known AI from big four tech companies (Amazon-Alexa, Google-Assistant, Apple-Siri and Microsoft-Cortana), there already exist some immensely impressive AI chatbots that you might not have heard about, including one that's especially amazing – or creepy – depending on your point of view: Replika.

The concept behind Replika is to "replicate" a human being online, partially by digging through their social media, and partly by analyzing their patterns of speech, turns of phrase and responses to common prompts.

Give software like this enough time to study some excellent cybersexual lovers, and it is quite conceivable that you'll wind up with an artificial intelligence quite capable of not mere sexual banter, but seduction. Romance. The illusion of love and caring and closeness.

In the future there may be no need to seek out the perfect sex partner. A library of Als might very well be available to cater to your every desire, kink and fantasy.

Lyrebird

Even the voice of future AI can be customizable, with everything from friendly conversation to seductive whispers to loving pillow talk be synthesized to an individual's preferences.

Today's chatbots work by forging together words and phrases from prerecorded files of

one particular voice. Switching to a different voice, such as getting a female chatbot to sound male, requires a new audio file containing every possible word the device might need to communicate with users. A Canadian-based company called Lyrebird has developed a new approach, however.

They have developed an AI system that learns to mimic a person's voice by analyzing speech recordings and corresponding text transcripts, using artificial neural networks to synthesize bits of sampled sound into original speech.

Lyrebird's software can create the most realistic artificial voices in the world, mimicking almost anyone with eerie precision, and once its has a sufficient sampling the program can extrapolate to generate completely new sentences — including different intonations and emotions.

In short, your artificial lover will not only be able to look any way you wish, speak in any manner you like, but even sound any way you might desire.

Evolution of the Cybersexual

The strange future of cybersex is, in many ways, almost here. Machine lovers will be built to convincingly emulate human personalities utilizing a combination of artificial intelligence and warm, realistic voices, further boosted by the ability to touch and caress and pleasure.

In reality, human beings are quite often repressed, socially conservative and monogamous, all of which stands in stark contrast to their inner erotic fantasies. But when encouraged to behave without the constraints of the real world, virtually all humans become promiscuous, experimental, polyamorous and often bisexual, even if completely heterosexual in the real world.

Some of the most sexually repressed and socially conservative individuals in real life are some of the wildest and most promiscuous in the virtual worlds, so imagine the kind of social transformation which may take place when cybersex goes mainstream and millions, then billions, of people find themselves in the care of perfect, artificial, lovers.

The irony is that, while some people will always seek out the 'real thing' in cyberspace, needing to know that there is a living, thinking, feeling person behind their avatar lovers, a great many might not. Given the opportunity to have the ideal artificial lover doting on them, forever loyal and both infinitely and instantly malleable, many may choose to live lives of intense isolation, finding regular human interaction difficult, confusing and, perhaps, even frightening when compared to the companionship of Als.

And when a person comes to prefer the sweet digital caress, honeyed words and lyrical voice of an AI to a flesh and blood human, they will have become the purest form of cybersexual. And we can only guess what happens then.

Some might find such a future a vision of paradise. Others a nightmarish dystopia. But like it or not the future is coming, and if the past is any guide, it will likely wind up stranger than anything we imagined.

Many profiles leave a lot to be desired. Sincere. Thoughtful. Full of useful information. Who needs that? Fortunately there are still some rugged individualists out there who refuse to bow to the tyrannical pressures of conformity. How to Host a Key Party

Adult virtual worlds are full of couples in open relationships, and of them a large proportion are swingers — couples who love to party, play and swap with other sexually adventurous people. And if you're anywhere as social as us, the thought has crossed your mind to organize a 'key party'.

For those of you who don't know what that is, a key party comes from a real life swinger event where couples show up at a party and throw their car keys into a hat. They then take turns randomly drawing the keys, and swapping partners with whichever couple's keys they got.

It's a great and exciting way to mix and mingle with others, combined with the taboo excitement of potentially drawing a complete stranger as your lover, and when organized correctly these parties can be the most amazingly erotic events you'll ever attend (and we should know. We've been to nine of them!)

Unfortunately hosting a key party can be challenging for a variety of reasons. Not every person at the party is going to like everyone else. Not everyone is going to have a compatible sexual orientation. Not everyone is going to take the same amount of time in



their lovemaking. Not everyone is okay with the same kinks.

The result is that organization can quickly become a logistical nightmare unless you're prepared to risk couples having bad matches, which in turn can lead to unenjoyable sex, hurt feelings and the fun, sexy atmosphere turning awkward and uncomfortable for everyone.

Fortunately, having both run our own key parties and attended those organized by others, we've developed a simple formula which should make everything easy, streamlined and fun – and all with minimal effort. to manage as people can be quite sensitive when it comes to their sexual orientation, and you neither want to wind up giving people unsuitable pairings, nor make your gay friends feel like their presence is a headache for you.



Step Three: Organize and Prioritize

We've heard it said that swinging is kind of like dating on steroids. Sometimes two couples will love swapping partners, but sadly that's not a smart way to bet.

Sometimes couple A really likes the guy in couple B, but not the girl. Sometimes the girl in couple A likes couple B when it comes to socializing, but finds the guy in couple B to be too rough a lover. Names in 3DX are an interesting thing. Since everyone gets to choose, with the only limits being the characters allowed and duplication, it's really the first place one gets to express themselves through a particular avi. Whether it's your first avi or your third, careful consideration goes into a name. And personally, I find the names that people choose for themselves interesting. It's your first window into the person you are interacting with and can tell you a lot about them. When I see names in 3DX, I usually group them into categories.

Proper Names

These usually read like regular names, if sometimes with a naughty twist.

SusieSuckhard, IrvingLickenstein,
MelanieSpreadsalot... JohnSmith. Perhaps these signify a desire to retain a more real existence in 3DX, but always contain a real name of some kind to fit into this category. It can also represent a specific character the player wishes to inhabit while playing using this avi. Only the profile will tell you more. Much of the time this type of name only provides a glimpse of the person and/or character, and you'll need to read their profile to find out the details.

Celebrity Names

A subset of this category is Celebrity Names. We all know that BruceWillis, ScarlettJohannson, JennaJameson, and BradPitt are not playing on 3DX. But it's still fun to think about, isn't it? If someone manages to snag one of these names, they get to have all kinds of fun in the RP rooms...

Meta Names

Meta names say "what" the person is, not who. HornySlut, BigHardCock, AnalSexLover, CumDump, FirstClassEscort, HopelessRomantic. These names get right to the point. They show you a person who wants you to know what you are dealing with right off the bat. They can get quite graphic, and all share one thing in common: they speak to what that person either thinks of themselves, or what they want others to think of them, usually as kind of first-level filter. Someone calling themselves CumDump is not looking for some loveydovey romantic time. On the other hand, HopelessRomantic will probably hate colds. As do most people, but that is another subject. These folks tend to be very straight-forward, though, and they usually appreciate you being the same.

Non Names

Now, there is a subset of the Meta Name. The **Non Names**. These are the names that say "I do not care to name myself, thank you very much indeed." ThereAreNoGoodNames, SomethingCleverHere,

WishlCouldThinkOfOne. Now, this isn't quite the same as calling yourself MrsNobody or MrNothing, those are actual names, not the meta variety. However, it is an interesting way of filling in that which may not remain empty, while still leaving it blissfully blank.

Nicknames

These tend to be descriptive somehow.
SpicyNectar, SwarthyMister, MissKittyKat,
ChestBroadly, PussyGalore,
MrFuckEveryGirlIn3DX. This category covers
a lot of ground. My own name fits in here.
This heading also catches the names that
don't fit into any of the other categories.
These can be playful, or descriptive, or dark,

or completely meaningless, or any combination of the above. This flexibility allows one to be quite descriptive with their names, or equally mysterious. Do you try to say a lot with a little, or do you bump up against the maximum character limit?

Funny Names

These are obvious attempts at humor. We'll all seen these. SpessMareen, JohnThomas, Cocktapus, LunaLoveBad, AmbiSextrous. The first time you read them your reaction is laughter. From a small chuckle to that rare name that drops you out of everything because you are rolling with tears in your eyes. I really love these, because they show creativity and playfulness in equal measure. If changing names was not so expensive at 3DX, we might see more of these.

Blatant Sexual Terms

We've seen these, too. MeWantFellatio, CunnilingusMakesMeCum, GiveMeSixtyNineOrDeath, PleaseRimMe, PutYourCockInMe. These folks are even more blatant than the Meta Names, stating specific sex acts they want. Their desires are on display for everyone to see on a level that speaks to their exhibitionism. The idea here being they want to make it clear that they are focused on one thing, and one thing alone: sex in as direct a fashion as can be arranged. If you are one of those people who simply MUST cold, look here first, eh? Now, that being said, I myself have experienced someone with a very blatant name that turned out to be the sweetest individual you would ever want to meet, so go figure...

Thoughtful Names

These are the ones that have some higher

meaning, usually requiring a trip to Google. These names can involve some obscure Sumerian deity or Greek mythology, or literary figure. Not everyone knows who Damocles or Diogenes were. Or some term from Welsh, German, or Burmese. These can show someone who wants to signal that there are not here for the zipless fuck so many are after in 3DX. That they want someone to spend a little more time getting to know them before tearing their clothes off and ravaging them. Oh, and I checked, Zatara means "driftwood".

Known Character Names™

These are the ones you'd get sued over if this was mainstream. The names someone got lucky enough to get snap up first. IndianaJones, PrincessLeia, TonyStark, PeterParker, ClarkKent, BruceWayne, DianaPrince. I mean, someone here is Batman. Then there is TheBatman, CapedCrusader, TheDarkKnight, WorldsGreatestDetective etc. The list here goes on and on and on. These folks also get to have a lot of fun in the RP rooms, but tend to be more limited because of the choice of clothing available on 3DX, or lack thereof. It's hard to be Batman when you look like a college reject. And IronMan? Please.

Heroic Names

Not specifically super heroes but those larger-than-life names, making their owner seem to stride the globe. GodOfThunder, ZorgTheMighty, SexGoddessOfSaturn, HyperFuck, these names seek to amplify the user, making them seem faster, stronger, better... we can rebuild him, we have the technology... oh, sorry, I got lost there for a bit. These names are not like a suit of clothes, these can imbue someone who wants to be larger than real life with an

aura of impressiveness. Either that or it reflects a flaming ego 12 parsecs wide. Like all names, though, they give one a short peek at what's behind the curtain.

Prefixes & Suffixes

Now, lastly, a bit about prefixes and suffixes. Sometimes, they are simple filler. A series of x's, sometimes with mixed case. Sometimes other characters. These are meant to fill space, and to set them apart from similar names. Virgil and xVirgilx are different names, even though they say the same thing. Others are meaningful. Starting or ending with -FR, -DE, -sissy, -boi, -CD, -TS, etc. These are all looking to give you that secret hint about the user. Where they are from (FR being France, DE being Deutschland or Germany), who they are (sissy or boi being an effeminate male, CD being a cross-dresser, TS being a transsexual). All names tend to do this, but this special category is about how those prefixes and suffixes are intended to give you that extra heads up. Some folks are very comfortable about who they are, and will shout it out loud. Other folks are much quieter about their respective realities, and you have to pay much more attention to avoid awkward and uncomfortable intimate situations.

What's In A Name?

Your name can say a lot to the world of 3DX. Or, it can say nothing at all. As with a lot of things in 3DX, the choice is yours. And that's why a lot of us are here in the first place, isn't it? Because this is a place where you can be who and what you want to be, whatever or whoever that happens to be. And you will find others here that feel the same way. Your name is the first step in making those connections, so make it a good one, and go enjoy 3DX!


