An Orgasm a Day



Orgasms Boost Your Immune System

Forget vitamin C. Orgasms are the best way to prevent the common cold. Multiple international studies by respected medical universities have conclusively shown that having an orgasm temporarily boosts your immune system. And when it comes to cybersex specifically, a 2016 Italian study showed that both male and female college students who engaged in cybersex twice



per week had an immunoglobulin level 30% higher than those who were abstinent—a level identical to those who had had real sex twice per week, and almost double that of those who reached orgasm twice per week through masturbating to conventional pornography.

Orgasms Help Regulate Your Cycle

A 2007 report by Planned Parenthood showed that several studies have linked regular orgasms—meaning once or twice per non-menstruating week—to more regular periods, along with relief from menstrual cramps at that time of the month. The effects seemed to be identical between those women who achieved orgasm with a partner, or though masturbation.

Orgasms Make You Feel Happier

No surprises there, though it's always nice to have a little scientific research to back up what you already knew. People who regularly have cybersex are happier, according to a study in the *Journal of Psychosomatic Research*.

Researchers looked at 400 college aged women, monitoring their mood, sexuality, and menstrual cycle, and found strong links between "simulated sexual intercourse" and an overall sense of well-being.


Orgasms Help You Lose Weight

A study published in the *Journal of Sex & Marital Therapy* showed that frequent intercourse and sexual activity, whether with a partner or solo, has been connected to a smaller hip and waist circumference for both men and women. That means that cybersex can help lower your risk for serious health issues like heart disease and type 2 diabetes.

Orgasms Increase Your Pain Threshold

According to Dr. Beverly Whipple, author of *The G Spot* and Other Discoveries About Human Sexuality, having an





orgasm produces a pain-blocking affect, so the next time you stub your toe, cut yourself shaving or get a tattoo, it won't hurt so much. That said, there is one proviso.

People who eat a diet high in spicy foods don't always get the pain-blocking benefit because the capsaicin found in chilli peppers prevents it from occurring.

Orgasms Will Help You Have a Healthy Baby

If you're pregnant, the regular release of oxytocin that occurs when you orgasm is highly beneficial. Not only does it help create a healthy pregnancy overall, but regular orgasms have been proven to help women carry their babies to term, especially in cases of women prone to miscarriage.


Orgasms Will Help You Live Longer

A South Whales study conducted over the course of 10 years examined the relationship between the frequency of orgasm and mortality among middle-aged men, who were asked about their physical health in addition to the frequency of orgasms.

At the 10-year follow-up, it was found that those who had two or more orgasms a week had a full 50 percent lower mortality risk than those who had less-frequent orgasms. Follow-up studies have since shown a positive association between sexual intercourse and women's longevity as well, so keep on playing 3DX Chat!

Kink Shaming... Yourself

Guilt is about something we did. Shame is about something we are. By JamieSweet

If you're reading this, you're probably kinky. And not just because of this article's topic, but because virtually everyone is. Most of us have at least one non-vanilla desire. Most of us 3DX Chat players, in fact, have several. And that, as it turns out, is completely normal.

A study in the *Journal of Sexual Medicine* surveyed over 1,500 people from all adult age groups and walks of life, and found that very few sexual fantasies are actually atypical. For example, 64.6% of women and 53.3% of men admitted to having fantasies regarding sexual submission. Most people of both genders desire to be sexually dominated.

Yet the western world, and especially North America, is steeped in sex-negative culture. Even if you didn't get an abstinence-only sexual education in school, you're likely to have grown up with the impression that sex—especially kinky sex—is "dirty". Most people will go their entire lives without confessing their innermost kinks to even their closest lovers, and will forever feel shame about even having them. And shame is so much worse than guilt.

When we feel guilty it's about something we did, and because of that we can strive to avoid doing that thing in the future. Perhaps even correct our wrongdoings through confession or restitution. But when we feel shame it's about something we *are*, and that's much more challenging to deal with.

Why Do We Kink Shame Ourselves?

I come from pretty much pure Irish stock, and if there's one thing we Irish are good at it's harboring shame. Perhaps its because of our long, miserable history of religious persecution, imperialism, effective slavery and extreme poverty. Or perhaps it's simply because, on some level, we feel a twisted kind of pride in our emotional self torment, as exhibited in the novel *Last Chance Saloon* by Marian Keyes:

"All that praying you made us do," complained Maggie. "And making us go to Mass. And starving us on Good Friday, and making us feel ashamed of our bodies and guilty about everything. No, Ma, you were the pits."

Nuala glowed with pride, truly she has been the best of Irish mothers.

And, unfortunately, we're not alone. Many people not just keep, but prize, the poisoned jewel of shame in their lives. It makes us feel morally superior to perpetually acknowledge our own failings, and we deeply resent those who don't seem to wear the same chains.

And, ironically, what could be more perverse than that?

How to Stor

Though we like to pretend otherwise, part of not being a sociopath is defining ourselves by cues we take from the society around us. And, unfortunately, there are those who like to make themselves feel big by trying to make others feel small.

It may take the form of an outright and explicit condemnation, a careless, tittering faux pas, or a cruel backhanded compliment, but it always stings.

That said, no matter whether you like whipping people, having large, uncomfortable items stuck up your rear end, or being dressed as Batgirl during sex, there are other people out there who share your kink (or have complimentary ones).

Connecting with other kinky people on 3DX is thus not only a great way of finding potential playmates, but to join communities that understand and accept you. Naturally not all your friends will share your kinks, nor will you want to be friends with everyone who does, but having people who don't think you have anything to be ashamed about is crucial to letting go of your baggage. Though don't make the mistake that it'll happen in a day.

Our kinks don't exist for no reason. They are part of who we are, what we've experienced and, perhaps, all that we've been deprived of. Humans are complex creatures, and just because you've found your place in the grand pecking order that is society doesn't mean you'll be instantly at peace.

Practice Self Care

Developing a circle of friends who accept and understand you is part of self-care, but to really let go of shame you need to treat yourself with respect and kindness.

Meditation, exercise, sleeping enough and healthy eating are all ways in which you can both increase your sense of self-worth, and increase your patience and ability to manage internal stressors such as sexuality-based shame. It's hard to feel good about anything, let alone your kinks, if the rest of you isn't properly cared for, so take the time to invest in yourself.

Do As I Say, Not As I Do.

As I write this it's 5:40 in the morning, and that's not because I got up early, but because I stayed up that late. Though I run orgies on 3DX and publish a magazine dedicated to virtually every kink there is, I know I have huge sexual and relational hang-ups.

I don't exercise. Half the time I border on anorexia. And though I try so hard to let go of my shame, I lay awake every night (that I even bother to try and sleep) thinking of all the ways I'm an awful person. So I get it. Letting yourself be *you* can be incredibly hard, so I do not give the advice here flippantly.

If you've never been stuck in the mire of shame, or have managed to get yourself free of it, I salute you. I hope one day to join you. But for those of you who, like me, self-flagellate yourself over your sexual desires and choices, know you're not alone.

I'm doing my best to follow my own advice, and I hope that you find it useful as well. Bit by bit, little by little, we can free ourselves from shame together.



The 2019 Cybersex Survey Results

The survey is done. The results are in. Let's see what we learned. By JamieSweet

One month ago our magazine launched a completely anonymous survey in an attempt to learn more about the habits and experiences of 3DX Chat players, and I'm happy to report that a total of 152 of our readers responded.

Since the survey sample was so large, no participant's identity will ever be known, and it was made clear that this was our attempt at a non-judgemental, purely scientific sociological study, it's my belief that the answers were overwhelmingly truthful, and as such accurately reflect what's going on in 3DX.

So, without further ado, here's the raw data for your consideration...

Question #1: Which adult virtual worlds have you been a member of in the past 12 months?

3DX Chat: 100% (152 of 152)

AChat: 19.74% (30 of 152)

ChatHouse3D: 19.74% (30 of 152)

IMVU: 5.26% (8 of 152)

MNF Club: 21.05% (32 of 152)

Red Light Center: 10.53% (16 of 152)

Second Life: 7.89% (12 of 152)

Yareel: 3.95% (6 of 152)

Other: 0.00% (0 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.00% (0 of 152)

Notes: The fact that 100% of respondents play 3DX Chat was pretty much a given seeing as the survey was

exclusively aimed at them. That said, it's interesting that the next three most popular games were the relatively small virtual worlds of AChat, ChatHouse3D and MNF Club, with a minimum of one in five 3DX players also having visited at least one of them in the past year. Meanwhile, huge worlds like IMVU and Second Life are far less popular, with Second Life capturing less than 10% of 3DX players and IMVU just over 5%.

Question #2: How many close, personal friendships have you established, and consistently maintained, in adult virtual worlds over the past 12 months?

None: 6.58% (10 of 152)

1 or 2: 25.66% (39 of 152)

3 to 5: 34.87% (53 of 152)

6 or More: 32.23% (49 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.66% (1 of 152)

Notes: Over 90% of 3DX plays maintain at least one meaningful friendship online, with more than half en-

joying three or more such friendships.

This can be compared to a 2004 Gallup pole which revealed that over 50% of Americans have five or less close friends in their lives, and a 2016 Facebook study which revealed that, though the average Facebook user has 155 "friends", they would only classify four of those as being close.

If the ordinary person only has four or five close friends in total, this may suggest that 3DX players tend to do a very large proportion of their socializing in virtual environments.

Question #3: Have you been part of a romantic relationship, such as a prolonged dating or marriage, within an adult world, over the past 12 months?

Yes: 67.76% (103 of 152)

No: 31.58% (48 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.66% (1 of 152)

Notes: The fact that over two thirds of 3DX players have had virtual relationships in the past year speaks to just how deep and meaningful online relationships can really be, and to how many people are seeking them in virtual environments.

Question #4: Is your real world biological gender male or female?

Male: 60.53% (92 of 152)

Female: 36.18% (55 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 3.29% (5 of 152)

Notes: The fact that five people opted not to answer this question may indicate that those who were at all hesitant about sharing this information simply opted out, this making it more likely that the data we did collect is accurate.

According to a 2014 Entertainment Software Association survey, 48% of MMO players are female, while several studies on female viewership of pornography indicate that roughly 27% of women watch porn videos on a regular basis. If we round these numbers to 50% and 30% respectively, the idea that adult virtual world populations are about one third female seems quite believable, and that's exactly what our survey says.

Question #5: In regards to 3DX Chat, how many alts do you normally maintain and utilize in the game?

None: 49.34% (75 of 152)


One: 26.97% (41 of 152)

Two: 17.11% (26 of 152)


Three or More: 6.58% (10 of 152)

Notes: This data reveals that not only do a slight majority of 3DX players use alts, but about 7% of them have multiple accounts (as it's impossible to have more than two alts otherwise).


Percentage of Players Who Use Alts

Question #6: Is your primary 3DX Chat avatar male, female or transgendered (transsexual or futanari)?

Male: 47.37% (72 of 152)

Female: 47.37% (72 of 152)

Transgendered 5.26% (8 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.00% (0 of 152)

Notes: This data, in addition to that provided from question four, gives us some idea of how many female avatars in game are played by biological males—a common topic of debate.

If we remove those who did not wish to reveal their biological gender, we are left with 147 respondents, of which 92 (62.59%) are biological males and 55 (37.41%) are biological females.

Meanwhile, removing transgendered avatars from the equation, we are left with an exact 50/50 split between male and female ones.

Assuming no biological female players use male avatars, that must mean that, at most, 18 of the 92 biological males who responded to our survey use female avatars. In other words, about one in five female avatars you see in game are actually being controlled by a biological male in real life—a high percentage, but far from a majority.

Question #7: Generally speaking, how many days per week do you log on to 3DX Chat for 30 minutes or more?

1 or Less Days: 1.32% (2 of 152)

2 to 3 Days: 19.74% (30 of 152)

4 to 5 Days: 23.68% (36 of 152)


6 to 7 Days: 55.26% (84 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.00% (0 of 152)


Notes: Almost 80% of 3DX players log on for at least 30 minutes, four days a week or more, meaning there

is an extremely high level of engagement with the game. This jives well with the information collected from questions #2 and #3 in this survey.

Question #8: Generally speaking, how many times per week do you engage in cybersex with other players in 3DX Chat?

1 or Less Times: 21.72% (33 of 152)

2 to 3 Times: 32.89% (50 of 152)

4 to 5 Times: 25.00% (38 of 152)

6 or More Times: 20.39% (31 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.00% (0 of 152)

Notes: This information was somewhat surprising. Though 3DX is a "sax game", one in five players only has sex once per week or less—almost exactly as many who get busy six times or more. This would indicate that a very significant minority of the player base frequent 3DX for non-sexual reasons such as building, entertaining and socializing.

Question #9: Generally speaking, how many partners do you engage in cybersex with per week on 3DX Chat? Example: If you regularly have cybersex four times per week, but each time it's with the same person, your correct answer to this question would be "one"

1 or Less Partners: 35.52% (54 of 152)

2 or 3 Partners: 38.16% (58 of 152)

4 or 5 Partners: 17.11% (26 of 152)

6 of More Partners: 9.21% (14 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 0.00% (0 of 152)

Notes: Again, surprising results. Despite all the sex rooms, orgies and swinging in 3DX, about one in three players have sex with one or less partners per week. Then again, with about two thirds of respondents hav-

ing reported being involved in a romantic relationship over the past year, perhaps semi-monogamy is far more prevalent than some suspected.

Question #10: Which of the following sexual practices / kinks do you regularly engage in during cybersex on 3DX Chat?

Heterosexual Sex: 85.53% (130 of 152)

Homosexual Sex: 35.53% (54 of 152)

Oral Sex: 95.39% (145 of 152)

Vaginal Sex: 93.42% (142 of 152)

Anal Sex: 71.05% (108 of 152)

BDSM: 29.61% (45 of 152)

Erotic Roleplay: 69.08% (105 of 152)

Gangbangs: 14.47% (22 of 1lol52)

Threesomes: 54.61% (83 of 152)

Orgies: 39.47% (60 of 152)

Virtual Escort Services: 17.11% (26 of 152)

Prefer Not to Answer: 1.32% (2 of 152)

Notes: It will be interesting to see if and how things change by our 2020 survey. Of particular interest will be whether virtual escort service usage increases what with the dynamic growth of White Breeze.

Conclusions

3DX Chat is not just a game, but a virtual society with it's own dynamic, multicultural culture. Adults of all ages and walks of life, and from every corner of the world, choose to make 3DX a big part of their lives, investing their time, creativity and emotions into it.

I, for one, find it all fascinating, and am very thankful to all the respondents for the information they've provided. You've helped us better understand this virtual reality we share, and our place in it as individuals.







Masters of Dance

From sisterhood to dance troupe, the story of the Bare Bunnies is unique. By JamieSweet

If you've spent any time at all on 3DX, then you've seen the Bare Bunnies: the most well-known dance troupe in the game. But, while you're probably familiar with their wonderfully positive personalities and the mesmerizing synchronicity of their sexy routines, you may not know the story of how they came to be.

I was lucky enough to get an interview with the trio that leads the bunnies, Flora, Scarlettt and Stella, and here's what they had to say...

Cybersex: The Bare Bunnies have become very well known in 3DX. How long have you been around?

Flora: We've been around for about eighteen months now, though it took some time to build our identity as a dance troupe. At the beginning, the Bare Bunnies were part of a social club called the White Rabbit Society.

Cybersex: And what is the White Rabbit Society about?

Scarlett: The WRS was a sisterhood; a group of girls that got together to chat and be friends and provide mutual support. At first, we just used to congregate when there was enough of us around. Then, slowly, there were more and more pre-planned parties and meetups.

The founder was a larger than life character called JaimeUK, and she had the fastest typing speed - and wit - of nearly everyone I know. Jaime always wore a bunny girl costume—the traditional black one. And, that sort of became our trademark. Jaime suggested





we always wear at least the ears to our meetups.

One day, a friend from outside the group asked if the WRS could organize a group of girls to pole dance as part of a big event she was having. We got into matching costumes and performed our routine, and it was enormous fun.

We started to get more and more requests, so we decided to give our dance team a name, and the Bare Bunnies was what we agreed upon.

Cybersex: So how did you come to develop your trademark synchronized dance routines?

Scarlett: At first, we did mainly pole dancing, then, one day, another group turned up to an event (we call them "gigs"), and had a group of four girls in sync. It was impressive, so we started to explore sync techniques ourselves.

We developed ways of using pairing and coordination in group chat to sync any number of girls. I think our record right now is thirteen at one time, but, in theory, it's unlimited.

We've also experimented with formations and how to orient ourselves for certain dances—like when we do dance 8 and flash the audience.

Another thing we developed was techniques for "syncing by eye", which is sometimes possible. We use that to fix syncs that have gone a little wrong, though, of course, we're aware of the technical limitations of the game, such as server lag.

Cybersex: So are you the original dance troupe on 3DX?

Stella: We can't be 100% sure we were the first. 3DX is about to celebrate it's 7th birthday, while we started our adventure in 2018. But, as far as I remember at that time, there was no other dance team with more than a handful of members.

Cybersex: So, how long does it take to train a new member? Sounds like the techniques you're using take a lot of practice. Flora: Yes, they do, but it all depends on the person. Some are just more naturally skilled than others.

Scarlettt: We run practice sessions about once a week, where trainees can develop their skills without worrying about an audience.

Flora: We have our own training center, and Stella is building the Bare Bunnies Academy as we speak!

Cybersex: How many Bare Bunnies are there at the point?

Flora: Yes, they do, but it all depends on the person. Some are just more naturally skilled than others.

We like to think that we give our girls more than just fun; that we help boost their self-confidence. Some of our girls used to be shy, but now they're confident leading a team in a room with a hundred people in it.

Flora: The Bare Bunnies is a sisterhood, and we spend a lot of time together. Four to six hours per gig, and, for a year, we've had an average of five gigs per week.

Scarlettt: As for the WRS, that still exists separately. Now it's a brand for our more "offbeat" events, like our fashion show.

Cybersex: So, are there regular venues where you perform? Are there any places you avoid?

Flora: We don't do recurring gigs at the same place, and we don't dance in sex rooms. Those are a couple of our rules. We have a few partners—big groups like Synthesis of Sound and Heavens Chat—and we also dance for individuals, for our friends, etc.

Cybersex: Do you have fans who follow you around? Who make a point of attending your events?

Flora: We do, actually. Our dancers' partners are usually there to support us, and we have a few guys that are regulars at our performances.

Cybersex: A few other dance troupes have popped up in recent months, like the Pole Cats, for example. Do your two groups know each other, or ever perform together?

Cybersex: You've danced at so many events. Are there any special experiences you've had which you'd like to share?



Scarlettt: We have special, deeply satisfying moments all the time. Like when we have a big dance team out there, and we all get into perfect sync and it looks great.

Also, we have a little ritual that we do at the end of every gig. We coordinate to applaud the audience in sync, then we break formation and hug each other, and then we do the bunny run!

Cybersex: The bunny run?

Flora: After hugging each other, we run all over the room in every direction. It's a lot of fun, and looks great when there's enough Bunnies around.

Those are the special moments we get to share over and over again.

Cybersex: Any last message you'd like to send out to our readers?

Scarlettt: We just hope everyone enjoys our shows.

Flora: And, we'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of our girls. Daysie, Jen, Jasmine, Dove, Junbug, Stacee, Kim, Bunny, Snow, Loli, and all the others for their dedication and faith. For sticking with us through thick and thin. They make us proud to be Bunnies.


Nude Club





The Pseudoscience of Sex Addiction

Despite all the media hysteria, sex addiction simply doesn't exist. By JamieSweet

Thanks to years of media reporting on the so-called "porn addiction epidemic" and the "dangers of cybersex", there are countless people across the western world who consider themselves sex addicts.

Men who can only get an erection while watching porn. Women with a fetish they obsessively watch online. People who engage in cybersex so often they've lost all interest in sex with their significant other. And in his 27 years as a sex therapist, Doug Braun Harvey has seen them all.

That said, exactly 0.0% of the people that come to see Mr. Harvey are sex addicts, and that's because, from a rational, scientific perspective, there is no evidence whatsoever that such an addiction exits.

That's why Mr. Harvey, along with thousands of other members of the *American Association of Sexuality Educators, Counselors, and Therapists* (AASECT), issued a statement in 2016 outright denouncing the diagnoses of sex and porn addiction as pure pseudoscience.

The Birth of an Industry

The very idea of sex addiction never came from doctors, scientists or any kind of research. Rather it originated when a group of Alcoholics Anonymous members got together in 1979 to apply the (now completely debunked) 12-step method of recovery to their issues with pornography, adultery and other largely undefined "unhealthy sexual desires".

And it was that group, of which not one member had any psychological training, that spawned the hundreds of "sex addiction self-help groups" we have today, including Sex Addicts Anonymous, Sexaholics Anonymous and Porn Addicts Anonymous.

Groups like there are big business, running expensive rehab facilities catering to people who feel their sexual behavior is out of control, and to those who force their children and spouses to check in so as to save them from the widely reported scourge.

But Harvey and literally thousands of other experts across the United States, Canada, Australia and Western Europe have pointed out that there's nothing in the scientific literature to suggest that these problems—which range from having "too much cybersex" to continuously cheating on partners—can be rationally categorized as an addiction.

"Sex addiction is truly a social phenomenon, not a clinical or medical one," says Dr. David Ley, a clinical psychologist and the author of *The Myth of Sex Addiction*. "Most people who self-identify as sex addicts do so because they or their spouse read an article or saw a talk show about sex addiction."

The Complete Lack of Evidence

To cite just one example, in a study published in the journal *Socioaffective Neuroscience & Psychology*, researchers tested the neural response to sexual stimuli in people who self-identified as having issues with

sexual compulsions. In previous research of drug addicts' brains, heroin users exhibited a highly increased neural response to pictures associated with heroin compared to neutral images. But in the study of supposed sex addicts, researchers found that their brain activity was indistinguishable from the general population.

The sheer shadiness of the industry doesn't end there. The diagnosis of sex addiction by such organizations often ignores real problems, and that can come at a steep cost to those unfortunate enough to fall prey to them. One study of people in treatment for sex addiction showed that 92% were suffering from a real mental health disorder such as anxiety, depression, or schizophrenia. Yet instead of getting real help with these well understood and treatable disorders, they were participating in completely unscientific therapies to learn how to masturbate less.

"There's absolutely no research showing that sex addiction treatment actually works," Dr. Ley says. "But they serve a purpose—where men who get in trouble for sexual behaviors can 'go away' with the public appearance that they are committed to 'getting better.' Unfortunately, these patients are often deeply exploited, leaving treatment owing many thousands of dollars, and usually still struggling with the real psychiatric or social issues."

Yet in a callous bid to get as many paying patients into their facilities as possible, sex addiction organizations lump together every undesirable sexual behavior under the sun. Like cybersex? You're a sex addict. Masturbate? You're a sex addict. Practice unsafe sex? You're a sex addict. Use Tinder? You're a sex addict. Your spouse feels you exhibit any form of "bad sexual behavior"? Well, that makes you a sex addict too.

In his book, Dr. Ley tells the story of an 18-year-old man who came to him because he was convinced he was addicted to masturbation. "Turned out, he was only masturbating about once a week, but because he'd been taught that any masturbation was immoral

and unhealthy and dangerous, he was terrified. He went online and was diagnosed by sex addiction therapists and online group discussions."

Fake News

Yet despite the overwhelming evidence that sex addiction doesn't exist in any meaningful scientific way, and the now years old statement from AASECT and numerous other mental health organizations, mainstream news outlets from CNN to the BBC churn out endless reporting on how widespread the problem is.

Ten minutes of research would reveal that sex addiction is not listed in the *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders* (DSM), nor the *International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems* (ICD)—the two health catalogues every registered medical practitioner in the western world uses as their mental health diagnoses bibles.

Yet the mainstream media continuously and blatantly fabricates stories, willingly perpetuating a lie for cheap titillation, all the while propping up an industry that is destroying people's lives, and providing an easy excuse to people like Harvey Weinstein, who used "sex addiction" as a way to explain why the crimes he was charged with, including rape, were not his fault.

"So called sex addicts don't actually have more sex, they typically just feel worse about it," says Dr. Ley. "In addition to these religious conflicts, sex addiction is also a label used to excuse the misbehavior of wealthy powerful men, and is used to pathologize the sexuality of gay and bisexual men. All of this reveals clearly that sex addiction is a social construct, serving social functions around sexual control, not a medical or scientific one."

But despite (or maybe because of) the widespread predations of the sex addiction industry, our tiny publication will likely be the only place you ever read any of this. And that, in my opinion, is both sad and terrifying.

How To Have a Threesome

Tip #1: Everyone Should Be Excited and Comfortable

To begin with, it's always best if everyone is connecting with both partners somewhat equally, and that everyone is into doing it. The last thing you want is one person being ambivalent to another, or for someone to join in because they felt guilted or pressured into it.
